What Kind of Mindset Do You Have?



I can learn anything I want to. When I'm frustrated, I persevere. I want to challenge myself. When I fail, I learn. Tell me I try hard. If you succeed, I'm inspired. My effort and attitude determine everything.



I'm either good at it, or I'm not. When I'm frustrated, I give up. I don't like to be challenged. When I fail, I'm no good. Tell me I'm smart. If you succeed, I feel threatened.

My abilities determine everything.

As educators, we are becoming more aware of fixed and growth mindsets and the importance of instilling a positive mindset in our students. When praising your child, praise your child for the process so that they can see how their effort contributed to their success. With a growth mindset, everyone sees how hard work and effort contribute to success. Model for your child that we learn from our mistakes. We do not want children to give up when faced with difficulties and challenges.

According to Carol Dweck, "We found that students' mindsets—how they perceive their abilities—played a key role in their motivation and achievement, and we found that if we changed students' mindsets, we could boost their

achievement. More precisely, students who believed their intelligence could be developed (a growth mindset) outperformed those who believed their intelligence was fixed (a fixed mindset). And when students learned through a structured program that they could "grow their brains" and increase their intellectual abilities, they did better. Finally, we found that having children focus on the process that leads to learning (like hard work or trying new strategies) could foster a growth mindset and its benefits."

People are not in a growth mindset all of the time nor in a fixed mindset all of the time. Let's start now thinking about the messages we send with our words and actions.


DRESS CODE

All students in grades 3-5 will participate in the Florida Standards Assessments (FSA). These assessments measure how well the students are learning the Florida Standards. Whether your child is taking the FSA or not, he/she is working towards mastery of the standards at his/her grade level. The Florida Standards prepare students for college and career readiness by focusing on analytical thinking. Our students are ready for these assessments. We are confident the Fairlawn Patriots will continue to shine.

Let's get ready! Encourage your child to do his/her very best. Getting ready for an assessment requires more than studying. Make sure your child eats a healthy breakfast. Free breakfast is available to students during testing weeks. Make sure they arrive no later than 8:15 if they are eating breakfast. Make sure your child gets a good night's sleep. Remind your child to read and reread the directions and questions carefully and use all of the strategies they have been taught. Work out all of the math problems. Use time wisely. Leave cell phones and electronic devices at home. Students cannot have an electronic device or cell phone on their person. If they bring it to school, it must be in their bookbag in the off position.
