NHS Selection Criteria

Leadership - the student who exercises leadership:

- * Is resourceful in proposing new problems, applying principles, and making suggestions.
- * Demonstrates leadership in prompting school activities.
- * Exercises influence on peers in upholding school ideas.
- * Contributes ideas that improve the civic life of the school.
- * Is able to delegate responsibilities.
- * Exemplifies positive attitudes.
- * Inspires positive behavior in others.
- * Demonstrates academic initiative.
- * Successfully holds school offices or positions of responsibility, conducts business efficiently and effectively, and is reliable and dependable without prodding.
- * Demonstrates leadership in the classroom, at work, and in school activities.
- * Is thoroughly dependable in any responsibility accepted.

Service - the student who serves:

- * Is willing to uphold scholarship and maintain a loyal school attitude.
- * Participates in some outside activity: Girl Scouts; Boy Scouts; church groups; volunteer services for the aged, poor, or disadvantaged, family duties.
- * Volunteers dependable and well organized assistance, is gladly available, and is willing to sacrifice to offer assistance.
- * Works well with others and is willing to take on difficult or inconspicuous responsibilities.
- * Cheerfully and enthusiastically renders and requested service to the school.
- * Is willing to represent the class or school in inter-class and inter-scholastic competition.
- * Does committee and staff work without complaining.
- * Shows courtesy by assisting visitors, teachers, and students.

Character - the student of character:

- * Takes criticism willingly and accepts recommendations graciously.
- * Constantly exemplifies desirable qualities of personality (cheerfulness, friendliness, poise, stability).
