In Dress Code



Shirts: Tucked in so waistline is showing

- Solid color collared shirts (polo or oxford style)
- Turtlenecks
- #Northport K-8 School Spirit Shirt may be worn any day of the week ~Must Say Northport K-8~

Examples of Out of Dress Code

- Sleeveless / backless shirts
- #T-shirts (exception: Northport spirit shirts)
- Transparent (see through)
- Visible display of underwear / camisoles
- Shirts over collared shirts
- Revealing clothing (Ex: No Cleavage, etc.)
- Logos larger than 2" (pocket sized)

Pants/Skirts/Capris, Skorts, Shorts, etc... (all bottoms)

- Solid color black, khaki, brown, navy blue or
- Wear belt (if there are belt loops)
- Plain jeans
- Hemline beyond the fingertips
- Worn at waistline

- Logos larger than 2" (pocket sized)
- Graphics of any kind
- Rolled up, cutoffs, frayed or ripped
- Leggings with short skirts
- Undergarments exposed (attached or separate)
- Spandex/Pajamas/Athletic Shorts/Sweat Pants

Dresses:

Hemline beyond the fingertips

Backless, Sleeveless, Strapless or Spaghetti Straps

Belts:

- Must be worn with loops on skirts/pants and visible at all times (exception – kindergarten & 1st grade children)
 - Small buckle size (buckle must be 2" or less)
- Skulls, Crowns, etc.

Shoes:

- Shoes/tennis shoes with a back or back strap (all straps/laces must be properly fastened)
- Closed toe

- Wheels or Musical
- Flip Flops / Sandals / Slippers (This is a safety issue)

Hair:

Neatly done in natural colors

- Any color that is unnatural
- Curlers or other hair grooming items

Accessories:

- Jewelry (less than ½ inch in size). Pierced ears are permitted: earrings should be no longer than 2 inches below the ear
- Plain or charm style necklaces
- Sweatshirts and jackets should be worn properly and may have multiple logos or graphics less than 2" that are school appropriate
- Sunglasses inside the building/classrooms
- Gages in ears
- Tongue, nose or other visual body piercings
- Pointed or sharp objects
- Chains Dog or Heavy (Safety Issue)
- Hats / Caps
- Sweatshirts & jackets tied around the waist
- Wearing sweatshirt or jacket hoods

Positive Behavior Support

We will be following our Positive Behavior Support (PBS) Plan. Students out of dress code will receive a Behavior Incident Report (BIR) from the homeroom teacher. After three BIRs, a referral will be written and the response will be handled according to the St. Lucie County Code of Conduct.

^{***} Administration/designees shall be the final judge of wearing apparel/accessories. They will determine whether or not such is appropriate, disruptive, offensive, distracting or in violation of health and safety rules.

^{***} All clothing/items may not display vulgar writing, sexual reference, reference to alcohol, tobacco drug products *** All clothing/items may not display messages, writing or symbols which may intimidate, incite anger or portray harmful ideas to the health, safety and welfare of others.

^{***} Any gang symbols, tag rags, bandannas or any other gang related apparel is not allowed and will be confiscated.
