

PBDP/FPC Dress Code

Performance-Based Diploma Program is designed to get students “**back on track**”. One major part of our training is to encourage students to plan for the job market. School is the training ground for the job world and some **current trends** are not appropriate for school settings.

The individual school administration shall be the final judge of wearing apparel/accessories. They will determine whether or not such is appropriate, disruptive, distracting or in violation of health and safety rules. No clothing/accessories are permitted that promote drugs, tobacco, alcohol or violence. If not listed below, the student is out of dress coded.



All students may wear:

- ◆ Collared shirts/blouses with sleeves, must be tucked in and not see through.
- ◆ Shirts/blouses must have necklines that do not reveal cleavage.
- ◆ Belts must be worn in pants/skirt loops at all times and be visible.
- ◆ School sponsored clothes on designated days (club shirts, scrubs, academy shirts, athletic shirts, and honor roll shirts).
- ◆ Pants must be worn above the hip bone and must not be frayed, torn, cut, or have chains.
- ◆ Shorts/skirts or skirt slits must be knee length.
- ◆ No visible display of underwear.
- ◆ No jewelry that creates a safety concern.
- ◆ Dress shoes, tennis shoes, boots, sandals with back straps (no beach shoes or slippers).

Consequences for violating dress code:

First offense: Parent contacted to attempt to correct issue by bringing appropriate clothing for student. Student will remain out of class with Program Director until issue is corrected.

Second offense: Parent contacted for immediate conference.

Third offense: Recommendation to an alternative PBDP site.
