GRADUATION

OK GIRLS

- Sunday best dresses, skirts, pants suits
- Heels (that can be walked in/no stiletto), flats, dress sandals with straps on heels.
- Blouses, shawls, cardigan sweaters.

GUYS

- Dress pants or khakis secured at waist with a belt
- Shirts with sleeves, golf/polo, dress shirts with or without tie, need to be tucked in at all times.
- · Dress shoes or boat shoes

UNACCEPTABLE ATTIRE*/NOT OK*

- Accessories that may be used as weapons (chains, spiked collars or belts, wallets, sharp objects, jewelry, pendants, or charms larger than 2 inches)
- Clothing with holes, tearing, or shredding
- Visible undergarments
- Tank tops, undershirts or sweatpants
- No bare shoulders or spaghetti strap dresses
- Clothing that exposes excessive portions of the skin that may be viewed as inappropriate at a school function (e.g., bikini tops and bottoms)
- Short shorts
- Sagging pants, showing midriffs, sunglasses indoors, earbuds.
- *All students are expected to present and conduct themselves in a respectful and professional manner.
- *Students not meeting expectations will not be permitted to participate.
- * School administration has the right to exclude any student who is not in compliance with the above dress code expectation.

GRADVENTURE

OK GIRLS

- Dresses, skirts, capris or Bermuda shorts no shorter than midthigh
- Casual pants (including jeans)
- Casual blouses and tops with sleeves at least 3 inches wide
- Comfortable shoes (including tennis shoes, dress sandals, boots and flip-flops)
- Hats
- Purses under the size of 8.5" x 5.5" are acceptable

GUYS

- Casual pants or shorts (including khakis and jeans), secured at waist
- Shirts with sleeves (golf/polo, dress shirts and t-shirts)
- Comfortable shoes (including tennis shoes, dress shoes, boots and flip-flops)
- Hats
- Drawstring backpacks
- Chaperones may bring large backpacks

UNACCEPTABLE ATTIRE*/NOT OK*

- Accessories that may be used as weapons (chains, spiked collars or belts, wallets, sharp objects, jewelry, pendants or charms larger than 2 inches)
- · Clothing with holes, tearing, or shredding
- Visible undergarments
- Tank tops or undershirts

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Checkout During the School Day

Parents must come to the front office directly to sign a student out, and the student will be notified to come to the office. Teachers are not allowed to dismiss students from the classroom, cafeteria, or playground without prior notice from the office.
