Preparing for Student-Led Conferences

Step One:

Make sure your portfolio is complete.

Step Two:

By January 13, have your parents sign and return their invitation to the January Student-Led Conference.

Step Three:

Complete a class on etiquette and how to conduct a conference by Jan 20. This will be done in English Class.

Follow the script for the conference.

You will practice meeting your parents at the door, taking them to the conference site, offering refreshments, passing out the agenda, conducting the meeting in the time frame allowed, answering your parents' questions, and thanking your parents or adult advocate for coming.

Step Four:

January 25: Student Led-Conference. This is mandatory. Parents or advocates required to attend. Parents and students must complete the post-conference survey.

Student Led Conference Night

- 1. Follow the Dress Code.
- 2. Bring your parent or guardian or adult advocate.
- 3. Go to your assigned conference room. Your English teacher will tell you ahead of time what room to report to.
- 4. Your portfolio will be waiting for you in the room.
- 5. Conduct your conference with your parents. It will take about 15-20 minutes.
- 6. The teacher in the room will check your conference rubric off.
- 7. Turn your portfolio back into the teacher in the room.
- 8. Take your parent to the table at the end of the hallway and complete the short survey.
- 9. This is a presentation grade in ELA, Math, Science and Social Studies.

Q and A

- What if my parents do not speak English? Can I conduct my conference in another language? Yes- you can conduct your conference in English or another language.
- 2. What if I don't do the project?

This is required of all students at SOMS. It is a major grade in four subject areas. It takes 15-20 minutes to complete and a little bit of practice ahead of time to be ready for it. It is a great way for you to share your personal goals, hopes and dreams with your parents and share your progress. For parents who may have scheduling issues, we can work something out and/or you may have another adult advocate (grand parent, adult sibling, favorite adult on campus) be at your conference.

3. Why are we having student-led-conferences?

We believe that student involvement in the conferences makes learning active, provides opportunities for students to evaluate their performance, and encourages students to accept responsibility for their learning. Having students take charge of the conference makes them more accountable for what they are learning. In addition, this form of conferencing creates a partnership between the home and school. The high schools also have student-led conferences every year, so this is good practice for that.

Benefits include:

Stronger sense of student accountability
Stronger sense of pride in achievement
Productive student-teacher relationships
Development of student leadership skills
Greater parental participation in conferences
Greater parent-teacher communication
Increased teacher focus on standards

Student Led Conference Dress Code Dressing Professionally

Girls

Girls may wear dress pants, khakis, blouses or sweaters, dresses or skirts, and dress shoes. Skirts must be to the knee. Dresses must be to the knee and have sleeves. It is not acceptable to wear clothing that is sheer, ripped, immodest, or has cut-outs or spaghetti straps. Heels must be under two inches.

Boys

Dress shirt, belt, and dress pants or khakis, and dress shoes or your very best shoes. A tie is also recommended, but not required.
