

AICE

The Advanced International Certificate of Education (AICE) program is a rigorous program of academic study overseen by the University of Cambridge. The program has been in existence for over 150 years and is offered in over 160 countries.



AICE Provides:

- A flexible curriculum and focus on student strengths.
- In depth knowledge of subject areas.
- Development of student skills such as thinking skills, oral and written skills, analytic skills, and problem solving abilities.
- A pre-university curriculum and examination system that helps prepare students for success at the college level and in careers.

AICE at SLW Centennial

- Students who earn the AICE Diploma and complete the necessary community service hours earn the Florida Bright Futures Academic Scholars Award regardless of GPA.
- Candidates can earn college credit for each exam passed.
- The AICE program allows students to identify academic strengths and be flexible in the selection of academic and elective courses.
- Students can take AICE courses in grades 9-12.

Benefits of AICE Program

- Provides experiences recommended and valued by higher education institutions.
- Develops in-depth understanding of subject matter along with skills critical to success, such as the ability to:
 - Think critically
 - Carry out independent research
 - Evaluate arguments

- Work independently and in teams
- Communicate clear and well-reasoned arguments
- Understand global issues from multiple perspectives

- The chance to stand out from the crowd with a Diploma made up of curricula valued by leading universities around the world.

Flexibility of AICE Program

There are two paths to pursue:

Non-AICE Diploma Option

- Take a class or several classes in your area of strength.
- Earn high school credit.
- Earn college credit upon passing the exam.
- College level material.
- Higher weight on GPA.
- Evidence of rigor for college admissions.
- *Students receive General Certificate of Education subject certificates for exams passed.*

Diploma Track

- 7 classes with students who share similar interests.
- Minimum of 21 college credits upon passing the exams.

- Higher weight on GPA
- Qualify for Highest Bright Futures Scholarship (with required hours of community service)
- Evidence of rigor for college admissions.
- Prestigious diploma that is recognized by most colleges and universities.

- English Literature
- Psychology
- Geography
- Sociology

- Must have two teacher recommendations (part of application).
- Must write an entrance essay (part of application).
- Must comply with honor code policy.
- Must comply with grade/attendance policy.
