Welcome/Introductions/Attendance - April Sherwood

Review/Approve Meeting Minutes

- April Sherwood called the meeting to order at 5:42pm. She asked everyone present to review November's minutes and asked for approval. Diane White motioned to approve and Michael Bernard seconded the motion. All were in favor!
- April Sherwood gave a quick reminder that SAC members need to commit every month with 80% attendance rate for participation.

After school Science Camp—Jennifer Abbott and Erin Squires

- Erin Squires and Jenn Abbott who are 9th grade science teachers presented a proposal for a Science Camp for grades 9th – 12th. It would accommodate approximately 20 – 40 students.
- 2013-2014 69% students were at or above grade level for science
- 2014-2015 63% students were at or above grade level for science
- Description:
 - The students will participate in Citizen Science.
 - Conduct ecological surveys and research on campus
 - Research science topics covered in class
 - Learn study skills that will work for them and allow for independent learning
 - o Explore current events related to biology and environmental science issues

Objective:

- Enrich science learning
- Expose students to authentic experiences
- Prepare students for science exams
- Enhance the students' understanding of the nature of science
- Activities align with Biology and Environmental standards
- The estimated cost for three teachers, 116 hours would be \$4,864.00.

Impact:

- 9th graders practice science skills necessary for the Biology EOC
- o 11th and 12th graders who failed can remediate the gaps in their knowledge
- Science Camps' goal is to reduce the number of students failing the Biology EOC
- The teachers would be able to pinpoint weaknesses. We will tailor activities to students and experience science in the real. It would be relaxed and hands on.
- Lewis Coriolan asked if chemistry could be added in to help the students. Jenn Abbott said that we can bring chemistry into it.
- Susan Seal- The idea started with ESE students to help them with words and make that connection.
- Jenn Abbott- We want the students to experience science and make it more fun for them.
- This would start in February to April. We have a total of \$7,175.50 in SAC as of right now. April Sherwood asked for a motion to approve. Michael Bernard motioned to approve and Regina Tápanes seconded the motion. All were in favor!

Principal's Report – Susan Seal

- This month is short. Project Graduation
- 184 students have not passed the reading FCAT which is down to 145. 112 students have not passed the math which is down to 95. We looked at the 12th grade students and we asked them if they wanted to take the test again. Some of them did want to take the test again. Math and reading moved on. We will continue to move on. Boot camp will help find ways to pass the test. It will begin in January. More updates to follow.
