VPK is in Full Bloom! This month, our class will focus on Spring and Growing Things. Students discuss the similar needs of living things and describe how plants are similar/different. Students continue to identify letters and letter sounds as they begin creating onset and rime by changing beginning sounds. They will also recognize words with target beginning sounds while focusing on letters G, J, and V. In emergent literacy, students will continue to review concepts of print, and identify author, illustrator, setting, character, and main idea. They will deepen their knowledge comparing texts as well as identifying the author's purpose. In Math, students will continue to practice rote counting 30 and higher, and creating and comparing sets up to 8. Lastly, students will use higher order thinking skills as they learn through play as we conduct various experiments where they will be able to brainstorm, predict, and make observations to collect data during Science.

Kindergarten

Kindergarten is now entering the fourth and final quarter of the school year. The students have been working so hard preparing for first grade! Please continue to help your child at home by reading with them each night and asking questions about the story. Also, continue practicing the sight words daily. In math, students will be working on comparing 2D & 3D shapes, non-standard measurement, counting to 100 by ones, and counting on up to 100. In writing, students will continue working on independently writing sentences on a topic and drawing a detailed picture to match. The students loved participating in our special Hop into Spring Day. They practiced and reviewed many of their new skills. Thank you for your continued support!

1st grade

First graders are on the move and working diligently as we began our fourth quarter. In Math we completed the unit on Money and Time, and we began the unit on two- and three-dimensional figures. In Reading we read non-fictional texts focusing on text features. In Social Studies we learned about economics – careers, money and trade, and spending vs. saving. Coming up on April 14th, first grade will have their field day. As we continue in this quarter, it is so important that the students practice their high frequency words daily, which helps them to become more fluent readers and ready for second grade!

2nd grade

Second grade will be "hopping" into a busy month ahead □ Students will be taking their end of year STAR placement tests this month in reading and math. An informational parent night is being held to share important information about this testing with you. Please attend if you are able. Our students are excited to explore 3D (solid) shapes and graphing/data in math this coming month. Please continue using XtraMath.org for practicing basic fact fluency and review. In reading students will continue working with informational text and exploring text features such as diagrams, captions, maps, subheadings, and more! We will continue focusing on the central idea of texts and what the author's purpose for writing each of our texts is. Please continue reading nightly and having discussions about texts with your child at home. In writing We will be working on research reports and text based writing responses using previously learned capitalization, punctuation, and grammar skills. As we work through the last nine weeks of school, please make sure all students adhere to our school dress code. T-shirt logos/graphics MUST be smaller than two inches and ALL shirts MUST have sleeves. For the complete dress code please visit our school website or ask for a hard copy to be sent home. 3rd grade

It's right around the corner and 3rd grade is ready! The FAST reading test is May 2nd and the math is May 4th. We are confident that all our hard work will pay off. The reading test includes various types of passages (literature, nonfiction, plays, poetry). The test is timed, and te session will be 120minutes with a short break in between. We want to remind parents to ensure your child is getting their rest and eating a good breakfast before school and to encourage them to do their best. Please be on the lookout for more information about the upcoming assessments in the next few weeks.

4th grade

4th graders are digging deep in Quarter 4 as we discover Earth's structures. Reading continues to build upon the benchmarks we have been teaching all year. Our focus is on comprehension and vocabulary working toward our goals. In Math we dove into interpreting data ,and now are in the middle of geometry! We have seen some awesome ideas come to light as students discover Math in the world around us. Our State Writing Test is April 11 and 12. Our State Reading Test is May 16 and Math is May 18! Please do not schedule appointments on these dates if possible. We know students do better taking tests with their regular teachers, rather than makeups with others. Thank you for your support in the success of your child.

5th grade

This month in reading our radiant readers will be diving into Unit 8: Water: Fact and Fiction. In this unit, students will read works of fiction and nonfiction related to water. They will synthesize information to build the understanding that water is an essential resource that supports all life on Earth. With the end of the year approaching so quickly, our fantastic fifth grade readers are sharpening their tools in reading and working extra hard!

In writing, students will continue to work on their historical fiction narrative writing centered around the American Revolution. They will be fine tuning their skills in preparation for the Statewide Writing Field Test. Students will be taking the test on Tuesday, April 11, 2023. This is an opportunity for them to show the skills that they have learned this year. The test itself will set a baseline for what is to be expected in the area of writing on state testing in future years.

"May the force be with you" is a strange thing to say to someone, because there's never a moment when forces aren't with us. Forces are the hidden power behind everything that happens in our world— and beyond. Forces in Motion is our last chapter. Students will understand pushes and pulls and how they relate to everyday life. Our scientists are also completing the finishing touches on their science fair projects.

This month in math, we are working on unit conversions. Students will focus on both customary and metric units of measurements. Unit conversions is our final unit of the year. Once we have completed it, we will move into a cumulative review of all 5th grade math standards in preparation for our final FAST assessment of the year on May 11th.

As well, we are looking forward to our end of the year field trip to SeaWorld on Friday, May 19th. All money and permission slips are due by Friday, April 28th. You can pay online at www.schoolpay.com. The cost is \$65 per student and \$75 per chaperone.
