During the past four weeks, children were introduced to school routines and to the adventures they encountered as they began their educational journey. They met the people at their school, learned about school rules and routines, sang songs, played games, listened to engaging stories, and began interacting with their classmates. They learned about their physical bodies and explored the wonders of their thoughts and feelings. Thank you, parents, for your continued support and for trusting me with your little one. We are looking forward to a wonderful year ahead!

## Kindergarten

We are so excited to begin our adventures in Kindergarten. We are exploring and learning new routines and how to effectively express ourselves in our new environments. Please work with your child to establish a daily routine that your child can count on. A predictable bedtime, mealtime, time for practicing skills, and a time to be read to, are all factors that create stability in a child's life. If you have any questions or concerns, please do not hesitate to contact your child's teacher. Welcome to Kindergarten!

#### 1st grade

Our First Grade students are having a blast with their new friends and new teachers! We have been routinely practicing the school classroom rules and procedures. Students have been doing an amazing job transitioning into first grade. However, there are a few health safety practices we would like to see happening. Please help your child practice sneezing and coughing into their arm. We have hand sanitizer and a sink with soap in every classroom to practice proper hand washing skills. We are excited to learn, grow, and have fun this year! Please do not hesitate to reach out to your child's teacher with questions or concerns.

#### 2nd Grade

Hello families! Second grade is off to a great start this school year. We have spent time practicing rules, routines and procedures to set us up for success this year. Students have also just finished their fall state assessments (STAR tests). Please contact your child's teacher to review their scores. This month we will be traveling to the oxbow eco center on our first field trip. Please make sure that you keep a look out for permission slips and important information about the trip in your child's Tuesday folder. If you plan to request to be a chaperone, please make sure that you have filled out the district volunteer application online and have been approved AT LEAST two weeks prior to the trip. We are thrilled to start our reading and science unit on animals and their habitats. Please make sure that your child is reading nightly and filling in their reading log. An important math skill that students are working on right now is addition and subtraction fact fluency. Please make sure that your child routinely practices their math facts at home. This can be done with flash cards, memory matching games, and card games where you and a partner each flip a card over. The goal is to be the first person to add the two cards together and say the correct sum. We also ask that you encourage your child to write freely and regularly. Reminding them to use capitals, spacing between words, ending punctuation and their neatest handwriting. These skills may seem simplistic, but making sure that your child uses them habitually is very important. Thank you for such a great start to the school year.

#### 3rd grade

Welcome to 3rd grade! We are so excited to have an "A"mazing year. In August, third graders worked on building relationships with classmates and staff. It is so exciting to see the students who are returning and our new students to Bayshore this year!

During the month of September, we will be finishing up our place value unit and moving on to multiplication! Remember to practice your fact fluency. Xtramath.org or flash cards are some fun ways to practice fluency. In reading, we are working with our new curriculum that encompasses central idea, author's purpose, and compare and contrast. Make sure you are reading for 30 minutes every night to practice fluency.

This is going to be a F"A"NTASTIC year in third grade!

#### 4th grade

Learning is in full force already this year! Fourth Grade is off to a wonderful start in Reading as we begin our new year with Benchmark. Our first Unit in Benchmark is Observing Nature and our students will learn about how we respond to nature! In writing, we have begun our new writing program Top Score! We are having a great time starting off our writing process by writing about some of our favorite things!! Math class is rigorously busy with learning as well. We began the year by reviewing place value for our first unit and will move into our multiplication unit next. Memorizing multiplication facts is essential for making the upcoming units a breeze. Each day students are reviewing previous facts and practicing math fluency using the Xtra Math program. Students are also able to practice this at home. The more fluent, the easier math becomes. In Science class, we have learned all about lab safety and the practices of Science which will set us up for all the interesting things we will learn and work on this year. Being at school every day is essential as there is so much we learn each day!

## 5th grade

Fifth grade has had a wonderful start to the school year! In Math, we are focusing on long multiplication and long division using the standard algorithm as well as order of operations. Please ensure your child is practicing their multiplication facts weekly! In science students will learn about living things. This chapter includes a review of flowers and non-flowering plants. We will also cover the human body and the organ systems that keep it running. In writing, students will start with information/expository writing. They will be using the text and information from the reading chapter on living things to help organize and compose their essays. Our reading and writing lessons will tie together closely this year. We look forward to a wonderful year of learning together!

### Positive Behavioral Interventions & Supports (PBIS)!!!

At Bayshore we are delighted to announce we earned PBIS Platinum status for the 22-23 school year! At Bayshore, it is our practice and belief that through recognizing and rewarding positive behavior, every child is provided opportunities for success. Through PBIS, students are rewarded for showing their SPOTS (pictured below) by receiving jazzy cash. Once students receive jazzy cash, they can use it towards a variety of monthly events that are planned for this school year. A few of those events include, wacky-tacky day, frozen treat day, and chances to win various prizes. All events are announced on morning announcements and are posted on our PBIS event wall located inside the school.




Please reinforce PBIS expectations with your child and discuss how they are earning and spending their jazzy cash. We are looking forward to another great year promoting positive behavior!

Parent pick up safety & procedures
One of St. Lucie County Public School's priorities is to provide safe and caring
schools. Current dismissal procedures are noted below, as a reminder, for your
review:

- Parents/Guardians must remain in their vehicles at all times during arrival/ dismissal.
- Please stay outside of the yellow line so doors have plenty of room to open and provide a safe walking path for students and staff.
- Please stay off your phones while in line. Parent pick-up line is a no phone zone.
- Please make sure your labeled car tag with student name(s) and grade(s) is hanging on the rear-view mirror and clearly visible to Bayshore staff until exiting the camous.
- School personnel will escort walkers and bike riders to their designated area.
   All students crossing Bayshore Blvd. or SW Sea Holly Street must do so at the corner assisted by the assigned crossing guards.
- If you need to pick-up your child early, you must follow the procedures
  outlined in the student handbook in the section labeled "Dismissal During the
  Day". We ask that you do not sign your child out after 2:45 p.m. Left lane will
  be closed at 8:15 a.m. and 2:45 p.m.
- Vehicles are NOT permitted to enter campus using Sea Holly Drive for arrival or dismissal. Please use the following traffic pattern:
- Cars must go around campus to enter the car loop using SW Nautical Ave., then use Buffum Ln. as their connecting street to SW Sea Holly. Cars will not be able to turn on SW Sea Holly from Bayshore Blvd. No cars are permitted on SW Wende Ln; this is for school buses only. See map on the back
