Standardized Assessments

Choose to do well

Here are four ways to help your child be successful during state testing.

1. Explain that the test will show how much they have learned. Encourage your children to try their best, but don't put so much emphasis on it that they feel stressed.
2. Practice the test format. Practice tests can be accessed online at www.fsassessments.org.
3. Limit activities the night before the test. You may want to avoid having guests for dinner or skip a brother's baseball game if it means being out late. Be sure your child gets to bed on time and sets an alarm for the next morning.
4. On test day, ensure that your child gets to school on time, and has a breakfast at home, or a free nutritious breakfast at school.

Guidance Corner

Attendance Matters!!!

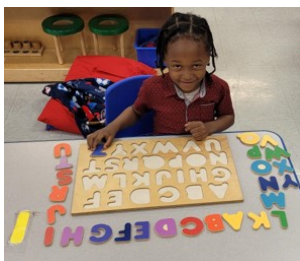
Showing up for school has a huge impact on a student's academic success starting in kindergarten and continuing through high school. Families play a key role in making sure that students get to school safely every day, and understanding why attendance is so important for success in school and in life.

We realize some absences are unavoidable due to health concerns or other circumstances. However, we also know that when students miss too much school, regardless of the reason, it can cause them to fall behind academically. Your child is less likely to succeed if he or she is chronically absent. Chronically absent includes missing just two days every month!

Please ensure that your child attends school every day and arrives on time.

VPK

During the next four weeks, we will learn about construction terminology, machines, and tools. Children will explore the tools used by many different professionals including the tools that are used in preschool. They will explore artists' tools, carpenters' tools, gardeners' tools, and scientists' tools. They will learn about simple machines and begin to use tools for measurement. But most importantly, they will use their imaginations as they use the tools to build and create. In Math, children will continue counting, sorting, patterning, and graphing during this theme, but we will also focus on identifying geometric shapes. We will talk about sides, corners, and angles. Our character education will focus on developing the concepts of cooperation and intentionality. We look forward to reviewing our letters and identifying beginning sounds as well as manipulating phonemes during literacy. Please remember to continue to read to your child every day to build on their emergent literacy skills.



Kindergarten

We have been busy learning so many skills! In reading, the students are enjoying earning our brag tags as we accomplish units of sight words. We continue to work on CVC words such as ham, pig, and tub during our centers and independent work. During whole group, we are working on comprehension while listening to fiction or informational text. Please work on this skill at home as well.

Our writing is continuing to develop beautifully. We are using punctuation marks correctly with great penmanship as we learn to write about one topic. Illustrations should match at this point with 5-6 details and a setting to match the writing. Journaling at home is a great way to practice this as well.

We just finished our math unit of measurement and decomposing/composing 2D shapes. We are all looking forward to more addition, subtraction, and number sense in the last quarter.

Science and social studies are a big hit with the hands on learning and virtual field trips this past month! The kids enjoyed making a book about landforms, symbols of the United States and even writing a letter to the president, Joe Biden. We are waiting anxiously for the reply!

As you can see, our school day is filled and we look forward to our next special day—Hop Into Spring day. As always, if you have any questions or concerns, please do not hesitate to reach out to your child's teacher. Enjoy your Spring Break!

1st grade

First grade has been learning about adding and subtracting with one and two digit numbers. In reading we have been learning about story structure and summarizing and synthesizing. In science we have been learning about Earth and Space. We have been using Writes From the Beginning to write about different topics. The students had a lot of fun at the i-Ready Carnival. Please continue to practice sight words and complete homework nightly.

2nd grade

As we are finishing up three-digit addition and subtraction with regrouping, we will now be moving into fractions. Please try to discuss the fractions of one-half, one-third, and one-fourth as well as what those mean. Students will be learning those terms, how to partition rectangles, and about equal parts. We will then move into how to tell time so it would be great if students could start getting exposed as we will be starting that unit by the end of March. I would recommend putting an analog clock close by as students sometimes have difficulty with telling time on the hands to the quarter past and quarter till.

In reading we are working on Unit 7: Investigating the Past. This unit is allowing students to see primary sources for historical understanding as well as see how the past shapes how our future develops. Students are working on skills such as identifying central idea and relevant details, using context clues, and phonics. Students should be reviewing their weekly sight words and phonics skills such as murmur diphthongs and inflection. Please make sure they are reading daily and explaining what they read about to work on their comprehension skills and looking back to find answers.

Keep up the good work!

3rd grade

3rd Grade has been in full gear these past weeks learning about our remaining required standards. Also, we have begun to review the standards previously taught as we make final preparations for the FSA. Students will be taking the reading FSA on April 5th and 6th. Please make a point to review reading assignments as they come home, helping your child make corrections to their work and explain their answers.

In class, we have been focusing on text marking for reading. Students should be going back into the text and finding evidence to prove their answers. When they find details in the text, we underline or text mark where the answer is stated. Students should be able to show why they selected A instead of C or D. Please practice this strategy with your child at home. Most of the time, answers can be found right in the text. Students should LOOK BACK, reread, and find the correct answers.

In math, please practice addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division fact families. Knowing basic facts will go a long way on the FSA. Being comfortable with the facts will save time. During Spring Break, March 14-18, students should log onto i-Ready and continue to practice skills and strategies they have been learning and reviewing in class. Also, they can log on to XtraMath.org and practice math fluency. The next six weeks prior to the reading FSA are critical as we strategically review and practice the tested standards. Thank you for your support!

4th grade

We're working hard in 4th grade! In math students are working on identifying patterns in algebra. In Social Studies students have been learning about different African Americans that have made an impact in honor of Black History month, In Science, students are investigating questions about motion of objects. In reading students are learning to identify themes, summarize a text and make connections to their reading work. In writing students are continuing to practice writing opinion and informative essays.

5th grade

Our fifth graders are working hard to be middle school ready! In math, we are finishing up our decimal unit and moving into our measurement and data unit. This will include line plots and unit conversions. At home, please continue to have your child practice their division facts 0-12. For ultimate success, they need to be fluent in these facts. Have you ever wondered what makes weather? What causes it to snow, rain, get cold, or hot? Weather is simply the state of the atmosphere. For the next month, our scientists will learn about Earth's systems and patterns. We will start with rocks and minerals and move on to the water cycle and the different forms of precipitation. At the end, students will understand the difference between climate and weather as well as how weather is predicted. Are you going fishing? Then you better have a hook and some bait! The same is true of our writers! They are putting in the work writing essays, and part of that is making sure their essays are catching the reader's attention with the very first sentence or two! We call that the hook! They are improving daily and it's exciting to see so much progress. Ask your student what it means to cite. Ask what it means to elaborate. The FSA for writing is the week of April 7th. This is a huge part of their overall reading grade. We have confidence in them! Hook, line and conclusion! Finally, we are wrapping up our World's Finest Chocolate fundraiser. We exceeded our expectations and have raised some wonderful funds for our end of year activities. Thank you for your support!
