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What is CTE?

Career and Technical Education (CTE) opportunities provide students with a school-to-career connection. Fort Pierce Central High School offers a variety of CTE courses that lead to industry certification, enabling students with the training and certification needed to attain employment right out of high school. All Industry certifications are real-world certifications that are designed, administered, and recognized by industry. Students who earn Industry Certifications may have an advantage gaining employment or be eligible for post-secondary scholarships.

PROGRAM CLASS DESCRIPTIONS

-Aerospace Technologies Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University (ERAU)

New aircraft designs require testing and knowledge in various engineering concepts. Studies include Aerospace Engineering and aspects of other engineering disciplines. Students are dual enrolled and take their ERAU classes on site at FPCHS.

-Culinary Arts

Culinary arts students learn the art of cooking, sanitation, and preparation. Students then expand into food science, techniques, cuisine, and nutrition. After graduation, students enter the work field or study advanced culinary education.

Web Developers are software engineers who develop Internet applications. Students use software to create web applications and prepare for Industry Certification.
