<i>Exposition</i>	The beginning of the story, including the characters and setting.	<p><b>Setting:</b> Where the story takes place</p> 
<i>Conflict</i>	The problem that makes the story interesting	
<i>Rising Action</i>	The events that build suspense and increase interest in a story.	
<i>Climax</i>	The point of greatest suspense and intensity; it's usually near the end of the story.	
<i>Falling Action</i>	The events that wrap up the story	
<i>Resolution</i>	How the story ends and the problem is solved
