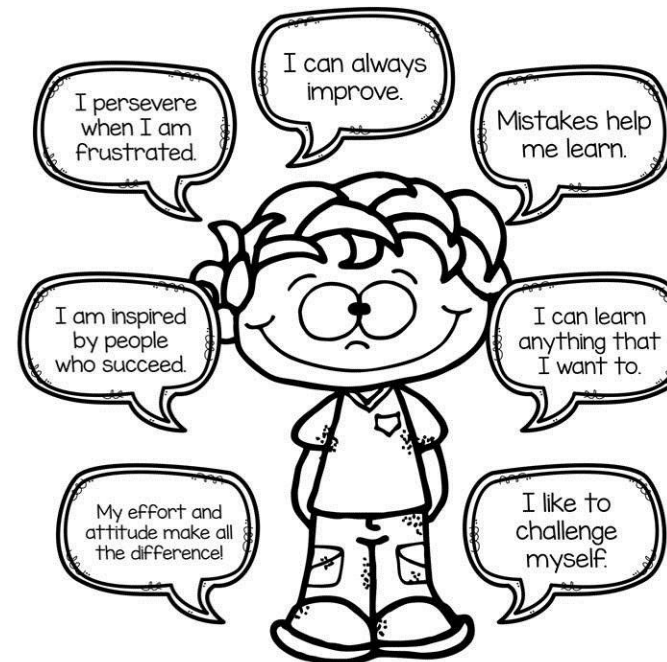

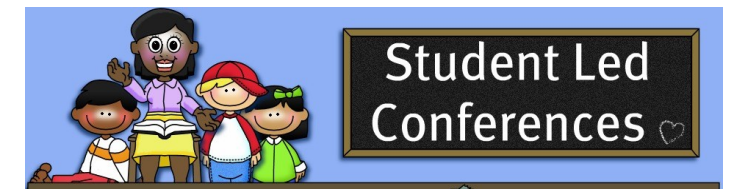

In reading, we'll continue to describe in depth characters, setting and events and compare and contrast similar themes and topics. Fifth Grade - Fifth grade teachers would like to congratulate our students who passed this week's Unit 8 ELA assessment. Your Child's Brain on Technology

The American Academy of Pediatrics recommends the following guidelines for technology:

Less than TWO hours a day for kids age 5-18

No more than ONE hour a day for kids age 2-5

NONE for kids younger than 18 months of age

Why Does There Need to be a Limit on Technology Use in Children

(Continued from last month)

3. Technology puts an obstacle in the way of the natural development of executive function skills such as the ability to plan, organize, manage time, inhibit inappropriate actions or responses, develop good judgement, control impulses, and gain the skills necessary for multi-tasking (working memory).. The result is a "double whammy". The over-release of dopamine creates a craving for more stimulation, but the impaired development of executive function skills impairs their ability to judge when or if they should use technology and for how long.

4. The brain is wired for a "fight or flight" response. This is a normal biological response that is designed to be short term. For example, if you are being chased by a bear your body produces the adrenaline needed to escape danger. However, when engaged in technology for hours, the body stays at the heightened level of stress. The more our bodies stay in a "fight or flight" stressful operating mode-the more our bodies stay in a "fight or flight" operating mode.

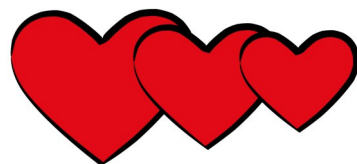
Spanish Lakes Fairways Outreach Club donated *80 pairs of shoes*.

Art with Pettit - Fall in love during art resource this February. We are making Valentine's Day cards and heart origami this year in celebration. Students will be making art for the people that are loved in their lives.

Drama with Ms. Gardner - Falcons in K and 2nd grade are currently working on how to develop a character for a play. These students are looking at how our actions and emotions can show how and what a character may be feeling or thinking. Students in 3rd, 4th, and 5th grade students are continuing their study of a musical through the eyes of the Lion King Kids. P.E. with Meyer - Hey there Falcons! Students will be expanding on their basketball skills during the first few weeks of February. Kindergarten through fourth grade will be receiving Health/Substance Abuse lessons during the last two weeks of February. STEAM with Reid and Garcia - In kindergarten, students will explore the law of gravity, understand the properties of objects that can be seen from Earth, and be able to recognize the repeating pattern of day and night. In first grade, students will explore the law of gravity, understand that there are more stars in the sky that anyone can easily count, and be able to identify beneficial / harmful properties of the sun. In second grade, students will understand that Earth is made up of rocks and be able to explain the process by which soil is formed. In third grade, students will understand that stars can be different and be able to demonstrate the law of gravity. In fourth grade, the students will understand the relationship between the rotation of Earth and the apparent movements and changes of the sun, moon and stars. In fifth grade, the students will continue to understand the water cycle and be able to explain how certain conditions describe weather in a particular place and time.
