HEAD:	UPPER GARNMENTS:	LOWER GARNMENTS:
<p>*NO Sunglasses, Hats, Caps, Visors, Bandanas, Head Covers, or Hoods are permitted to be worn on campus.</p> <p>-Earbuds, Beats/headphones, and cell phones MUST be off and put away upon entering our campus. (House Bill 379)</p>	<p>-ALL tops must cover shoulders completely.</p> <p>*NO rips/tears, or see through items and undergarments and cleavage will remain covered.</p> <p>-ALL tops may remain untucked, but must be long enough to overlap the beltline.</p> <p>*NO visible midriff.</p> <p>-ALL graphics must be school appropriate.</p> <p>*NO Halter/Tank/Crop or Spaghetti strap tops.</p> <p>-Hooded sweatshirts are allowed, but hoods MUST remain down while on campus.</p>	<p>*NO Leggings, tights, bike shorts, yoga pants, or bootcut/bell-bottom leggings.</p> <p>-Undergarments and the buttocks MUST remain entirely covered.</p> <p>*NO skin should be exposed above fingertips. Dresses, skirts, and shorts MUST be fingertip length or longer.</p> <p>-ALL rips/tears/frays must be BELOW fingertips, and in appropriate places, so that skin is NOT exposed.</p> <p>*NO Pajamas pants (flannel, fleece, or pants made to look like pajamas), slippers, CROCS or slides of any kind.</p> <p>-ALL shoes must have backs.</p>
