Our first quarter ended with our awesome pumpkin day. Second Grade

Happy Fall! 2nd graders!

Things are busy learning here at Parkway. Especially since we have received laptops for every student! Please consider for your child, purchasing a mouse and headphones for their most optimal work experience.

In reading, students are reading a balance of Informational and Literature text that connects to the topic of Who We Are As Americans. Students are learning how to identify the main purpose of a text, including what the author wants to answer, explain, or describe. Students are recounting stories and determining the central message, lesson or moral. We are also working on how to gain information from the illustrations and words in the text to demonstrate understanding of the characters, setting, or plot.

In math, Student will be able to measure, estimate, add, and subtract lengths. Students will measure and estimate lengths using units of inches, feet, yards, centimeters, and meters.

Class Dojo is a great resource to keep in contact with your child's teacher. Also, you can use it as a discussion starter to encourage your child to make good choices at school!

Ahoy 3rd Grade Parents!

November promises to be exciting for our Pirates because we are learning about Basic Economics through literature and informational texts. Our students will be learning strategies that good readers use to find out the main idea and key details of a text. They will also find connections between ideas or concepts in texts. For homework students should read for 20 to 30 minutes each day.

For math, our learners will be analyzing 2-Dimensional shapes. They will be able to describe the characteristics of quadrilaterals and categorize them according to their features. Soon after, students will use their knowledge of multiplication and 2-Dimensional shapes to measure the area of a rectangle. For homework, students complete 15 minutes of iReady Math each day.

Did you hear about our Real World Math Challenge? Information about this event will be coming home soon. We are excited to know how you and your family use math in everyday situations. Maybe you are baking cookies, or installing tiles for home improvement. Maybe you are weighing apples at the grocery store or counting money when you check out. There are many ways you use "math in the real world". We can't wait to see your posts!

Fifth Grade

Good afternoon AMAZING 5th grade parents!

We are just finishing up our APM testing which is our mock FSA. This will give us a good idea on what we need to focus on to best educate your student. In science, we will be finishing our unit on Energy and starting Forces in Motion. In math, we are working hard in Volume but will be finishing that up shortly to begin everyone's favorite fractions! Soon your child will be adding and subtracting fractions with unlike denominators. Please make sure to ask your child how they did on their Unit 3 test for Volume. Students are working hard in reading. They just finished their Unit 4 test, so make sure to ask your child how he or she did on the test. In reading, we will be starting Unit 5, which students will be reading a balance of Informational Text and Literature that connects to the topic Energy. Therefore, the students will be working on identifying the structure of each text and how a speaker's point of view influenced how events are described. Also, students are working on identifying main idea and key details in a text. In writing, students are working hard on how to identify quality reasons and use multi-flow map to elaborate on the reasons.

Please make sure your student is completing 45 minutes of iReady nightly for homework for both reading and math.

ESE News

This month's topic for the ESE Department is staying on task during the school day. Here are some strategies we use that can help our students work hard and make their families proud.

- 1 . When your child is off task use clear and simple instructions: i.e, "I need you to ____".
2. Teach specific non-verbal directives, like hand signals or visuals on their desk.
3. Stand near your child when they are off-task and verbally praise them when they are on-task..
4. Use social stories with your child when they need specific instruction for what it means to be on task.
5. Use first/then language (First you need to do your homework. Then you can have a break)
6. Provide frequent breaks for children who might need extra movement in their day.
7. Provide visual timers when your child on a break.

Health Room News

Everyday before heading to school in the morning students should do a quick at home health screening with an adult. If they answer YES to any of these questions they need to stay home until symptom free for at least 24 hrs. If a student starts to exhibit any of these symptoms at school they will be sent to the isolation room and a parent will be called to come pick them up.

Ask your child the following questions:

- Do you have a Cough?
Shortness of breath/difficulty breathing?
Chills?
Upset Stomach/ Abdominal pain?
Sore throat?
Headache?
Loss of taste OR smell?
Fever (100.4 or Higher)
