Our dress code is established to ensure a safe, respectful, and distraction-free learning environment that promotes academic focus and achievement. Adherence to the dress code reflects our commitment to maintaining a culture of excellence and high expectations for all students. School administration retains the authority to make final decisions on all dress code matters. The dress code is strictly enforced and applies to all students in grades K-8.

Shirts	- Collared shirts with sleeves - Solid colors of blue, white/cream, gray or black - Approved school logos or brand name logos smaller than child's hand - Spirit shirts on the last day of the school week *Must fit tidily so the shirt falls below waistline, but is no longer than the top of the thigh *Undershirts worn must be the same approved solid colors	- More than the top 2 buttons unbuttoned - Tight-fitting - Revealing (e.g. shows mid-section when hands are raised) - Sleeveless/off-the-shoulder - Collarless - Striped - Frayed or with holes *Shirts that are too long must be tucked in
Cardigans, Sweatshirts, Sweaters (these items are not considered outdoor wear that falls under the cold weather clause stated below)	- Solid colors of blue, white/cream, khaki/tan, gray or black - Approved school logos or brand name logos smaller than child's hand *Uniform shirts must be worn underneath	- Hoods worn on the head on campus - Ponchos, capes, trench coats, shawls - Items worn inside out - Striped (of any kind) - More than one logo
Jumpers & Dresses	- Uniform-styled - Solid colors of blue, white/cream, khaki/tan, gray, black or #76 plaid - Extend to mid-thigh or longer - Appropriate fit (not too tight or loose) *Uniform shirts must be worn underneath jumpers *Dresses that follow all guidelines above with sleeves can be worn with or without a collar	Frayed, torn, or with holes
Bottoms (pants, shorts, skirts, capris; including jeans)	- Uniform-styled - Solid colors of blue, white/cream, khaki/tan, gray, black or #76 plaid - Extend to mid-thigh or longer - Pocket logo/design smaller than a child's hand - Fastened above the hip bone - Appropriate fit (not too tight or loose) *If these clothing items are too big at the waist or fall below the waist, a belt must be worn through the belt loops (belt buckles must be smaller than 2 inches by 2 inches)	- Frayed, torn, or with holes - Spandex, nylon, Lycra or jersey fabric - Leggings/tights (unless worn under appropriate length dress/skirt in same solid colors permitted for those items) - Jeggings - Athletic wear (e.g. gym shorts) - Sweatpants - Pajama bottoms - Visible display of undergarments
Shoes	- Closed toe with a back covering the entire heel - Matching pair - Laces tied - Heels no higher than 1 inch	- Wheels on shoes - Clogs - Sandals/flip-flops - Jellies - Crocs - Cleats - Slipper-style soft-soled shoes (e.g. UGGs) - Walking shoes with individual toes
Jewelry, Accessories, Protective Face Coverings	- Earrings & studs worn in the ears only - Earrings/pendants less than 2 inches - Non-distracting headbands - School-appropriate protective face coverings (in any color/print) *Sunglasses may be worn outside only	- Excessive jewelry - Piercings other than ears - Sweat wristbands - Inappropriate/derogatory/offensive wording/images - Grills/removable caps on teeth - Kerchiefs, caps, hats, bandanas, doo-rags - Curlers - Combs/hair accessories that resemble weapons - Visible tattoos
Hair & Eyebrows	Natural color	- Unnatural or highly contrasting colors - Spray painting - Mohawks/Faux hawks - Images/writing through the shaving of head/eyebrow
Book Bags	- Any color - With/without wheels	Inappropriate wording/obscene images/writing (including skulls, drug, or alcohol-related)
Cold Weather Clause: Should the temperature drop below 50 degrees, students are permitted to wear winter jackets/outwear of any color, but only when outside the school buildings; when inside the buildings, the dress code must be followed, and the jacket must be taken off.		
Non-Dress Code Days: Occasionally, there will be days when students will be allowed to wear non-dress code clothing. Information regarding Non-Dress Code Days will be shared prior to the designated day. Students who participate in the Non-Dress Code Days must follow the guidelines for the designated day which will be indicated on the advertised flyer. Students who do not follow the guidelines for the designated day will be considered out of dress code. When there is a designated theme, students must follow the theme or stay in dress code. Students must be in dress code if they do not want to participate.
