### **Book Fair News**

What a "monster" of a great Book Fair we had! The media staff would like to thank all those students, parents, teachers and community members who made our book fair the most successful in our history. We sold over \$15,000.00 worth of materials during the nine days of the fair including the \$5.00 vouchers provided to 596 students for their participation in the summer reading program with 25% of that a profit for the Media Center. 82 books were purchased by individuals for their teachers' classrooms through the Classroom Wish List program and over \$570.00 was raised by One for Books donations to purchase even more books for classrooms. That total will be matched by Scholastic to help three national literacy organizations, as well!

Special thanks go to the volunteers who gave so much time and energy to decorating, counting coins, setting up, helping students with their purchases, working the cash register and so much more. We could never do it without them!

### **Changing Mindsets**

Every parent thinks/says, "I would anything, give anything, to make my child successful." But according to Carol Dweck, author of Mindset The New Psychology of Success, parents do many unintentional things that don't lead to their children's success. Some words and actions that we think are helpful are actually sending the wrong message to our children. When we tell our children messages such as "You are smart." "You learned so quickly!" "You got an A without even studying, and you are brilliant." most parents feel they are sending supportive messages. However, Dweck says we are sending a different one. If I don't learn quickly, I am not smart, If I have to study they won't think I am brilliant. After studying hundreds of students, she found praising their intelligence can harm their motivation and their performance. Want to learn
