# **Student Placements**

Due to the nature of the district-adopted model outlined in the SLPS Safe Return to School Plan 2020-2021, there is no guarantee that a child will be assigned the same class/teacher for the entirety of the school year. Because families will be permitted to flexibly transition their children to school or My School Online during designated periods, at the end of the quarter, and to maintain scheduling and class size requirements, staff members and students may be reassigned to different sections throughout the school year. The next change period for Quarter 3 will be announced soon. We appreciate your understanding with placements and hope that changes are requested only when necessary. Please let us know if we can assist you to make either your My School Online or Traditional school experience a better one. Please reach out to your child's school counselor so that we can support you.

# **Attention Grade 5 and 6 Parents**

SLPS is providing an online tool to be used as a practice test to get data from students who did not take the FSA last year. Adaptive Progress Monitoring (APM) is an online assessment tool to help assess students' current knowledge, skills, and abilities. Gr. 5 and 6 students will participate in a Reading and a Math practice test. The Reading practice test will be held on Tuesday, November 10th, and the Math practice test will be held on Thursday, November 12th. Both test events take place in the students' classroom with their teacher and are estimated to be 45 to 60 minutes. Since these are practice tests, no grade will be given for this test, nor will the scores impact their academic standing in any way. Look for more details from your child's teacher in the coming weeks.

# Daily Home Screening Tool & Health/Safety Procedures

As a reminder, parents must use the Daily Home Screening Tool to assess their child's health every morning. Any student displaying any of the symptoms listed must stay home to protect the safety and well-being of others. While at school, if your child reports to the clinic exhibiting one of the symptoms on the screening tool, parents will be called to pick up their child and he/she must stay home until symptom free for 24 hours. # Research Partnerships

As a research lab school, Palm Pointe regularly collaborates with Florida Atlantic University on educational research projects involving students and staff. Participating in research is an exciting and important opportunity to help inform and improve educational practices from the ground up. This year, our school is participating in three projects. Students in grades 3-6 have the opportunity to be part of a childhood friendship study led by Dr. Brett Laursen and funded by the US National Institute of Child Health and Human Development. The study began last year, and involves students completing a series of surveys throughout the school year. Another continuing project is focused on writing skills in elementary grades. The project is led by Dr. Lara Costa of UNC Chapel Hill in collaboration with Dr. Katie Miller of FAU, funded by the US Department of Education Sciences. For this project, Palm Pointe shares participants' writing samples with the researchers who are compiling samples from multiple schools and identifying trends. Palm Pointe's latest collaboration is with researchers from Yale and UConn, inviting students in grades K-1 to participate in an online Reading-based learning game. More information about this project will be going home soon. For all our research collaborations, parents are provided with detailed information and then asked to give consent prior to their child participating.
