Palm Pointe Music K-4 Open House

You're invited to join a music class! Yes, we are inviting you to come to a music class with your child. October 6-13 parents, grandparents and community members are invited to come to the music room to see what is happening! Be prepared to move, sing, play instruments and maybe even play a game or two. You will find that it is 45 minutes packed with activities that not only teach musical concepts, but reinforces reading and math skills. Check with your child or your child's teacher confirm the time and day he/she attends music class. I guarantee you will have a great time and maybe even learn a few things as well!

Supporting Reading at Home

- 1. Talk about books, especially the great ones: The Common Core says that children need to "read books worth reading". We all know that reading ANYTHING is great for kids, but they should be exposed to great writers and challenging content too. Lead by example!
- 2. Ask your children questions about what they're reading: One of the key shifts with the Common Core is its requirement that students (both orally and in writing) cite evidence from the texts they're reading to make an argument. Try asking questions that require your kids to talk about the content of the books they're reading. For example, have them give reasons why a favorite character was heroic or clever or forgiving.
- 3. Push your children to read nonfiction: Reading fiction is still a critical and wonderful part of learning to read, but the Common Core elevates the importance of nonfiction, or "informational text", as the authors of the standards call it. Does your son love gross bugs? Get him a book about cockroach infestations and let him dig deep into a topic that interests him. You might have a future scientist in your house!
- **4**. Encourage your children to write, write: The Common Core State Standards emphasize the fundamental link between reading and writing. Writing to persuade by citing evidence is a key 21st Century skill. Encourage your children to keep a journal or blog, or write a letter or an e-mail to their favorite author.

Million Father March

The Million Father March has grown out of recognition of the power of male involvement in the education of all students. A father who actively participates in the educational and social developmental life of a child is invaluable and irreplaceable. A 2004 summary study by The Parent Institute showed that at schools where teachers reported high levels of outreach to parents, reading test scores rose 50 percent higher, and math scores 40 percent higher, than in schools where teachers reported low levels of outreach.

Palm Pointe is inviting all dads to bring their child to school on Tuesday, October 7^{th} at 8:30am. You are invited to the Audeteria for a short presentation and then you will march around the school while staff and others cheer on our dads and their children. You do not need to sign-in with the front office. You will go directly to the Audeteria.
