#### **Supervision**

There is no supervision before 9:15 each day. Please allow your children to remain in your car until this time.

**FSA Testing Information** Specific letters with details for individual grade level tests and directions for virtual families have already been sent home. These are also posted on our school website, should you need to refer to them. All students are required to participate in the state assessment program. Lack of participation can result in the absence of vital data used for scheduling and placement. For middle school students enrolled in an EOC course such as Algebra 1 and Civics, a student end-of-course exam makes up 30% of the student's final grade in a course and a passing score on the Algebra exam is a graduation requirement. The current Grade 3 promotion rule is still in place. Because state assessments cannot be taken virtually, Palm Pointe has carefully planned to ensure separate, but optimal testing environments to promote a safe testing experience, with Covid protocols in place for both virtual and traditional students. **Virtual Student Information:** Your child will be in testing locations that have been sanitized and cleaned before their arrival. Your virtual child will not be interacting with traditional school students. Adherence to St. Lucie Public Schools' Safe Return to School Plan will be followed. To streamline the arrival and check in process for our virtual students, please drop off your child in the bus loading zone near bus Pole 6 no earlier than 10:00, and no later than 10:15. Watch for identifying signs. You must stay in your car as you drop off your child. You will see staff at tables ready to welcome your child and complete the Daily Classroom Screening for Students. Face masks must be worn and in place before exiting vehicles. So that safe social distancing can be maintained, students will enter the building through designated doorways. Students may bring water and their own hand sanitizer. Provided hand sanitizer will be also be available. Parents are not allowed to wait on campus for their child to complete the test. Please plan to pick up your child in the Gr. 1-8 car line at the time provided for that day. If your child does not feel well on the day of testing and does not participate on the assigned date(s), you will be notified of your child's scheduled make-up day(s) and time(s), as well as details regarding arrival and pick-up.

#### PikMyKid - Dismissal System

We have had many families transitioning back to traditional school over the year and wanted to remind all parents about our dismissal system, PikMyKid, which has been in effect since the beginning of the 20-21 school year. It is expected that all families use our system to ensure a safe and smooth dismissal.

- If you need to change the way your child goes home, you must
  do so in the PikMyKid app no later than 3:15 (or 1:15 on early
  dismissal days). Otherwise, your child will be instructed to go
  to the designated location listed in PikMyKid. If you do not
  have information about the app, please contact your
  classroom/homeroom teacher. If you have questions about
  PikMyKid, you may contact the front office.
- 2. If you are picking up more than your own child(ren), you must "announce" all children you are picking up in the PikMyKid app, so that all the students are alerted in their classrooms and come down to the pick-up location. Be sure to get the numbers from the parent.
- 3. If you are picking up in the car lines (either Gr. 1-8 or Kindergarten), you must display the name and number of your child on your dash or visor from when you arrive on campus until you leave. By doing this, it enables the staff to identify your child easily and check if he/she is announced, and dismiss him/her at the end all of which helps speed up our dismissal process.
