#### Cold Weather Clause

Should the temperature falls below 50°, K-5 students may wear dress code appropriate jeans, and students in grade K-8 are permitted to wear winter jackets/outerwear of any color, but only outside the school buildings; when inside school buildings, dress code appropriate attire must be worn; sweatshirts, cardigans, and sweaters must be in solid dress code colors and are not considered cold weather outerwear that can be part of this exception.
