Guidance Department News

We have three certified school counselors on our campus this year who are specifically trained to help all students in the areas of academic achievement, social-emotional development, and college and career readiness. If you have any concerns about the academic, social, or emotional development of your child, please contact Mrs. Apple for Gr. K-2, Mrs. Campbell for Gr. 3-5, or Ms. Rowley for middle school. Mrs. Rowley is currently out on maternity leave. Mrs. White is the interim counselor until she returns in October.

Student Placement

Due to the nature of the district-adopted model outlined in the *SLPS Safe Return to School Plan 2020-2021*, there is no guarantee that a child will be assigned the same class/teacher for the entirety of the school year. Because families will be permitted to flexibly transition their children to school or My School Online during designated periods, if needed, and to maintain scheduling and class size requirements, staff members and students may be reassigned to different sections throughout the school year. We appreciate your understanding with placements and hope that changes are requested only when necessary. Please let us know if we can assist you to make either your My School Online or Traditional school experience a better one. Please reach out to your child's school counselor so that we can support you.

Daily Home Screening Tool & New Procedures

As a reminder, parents must use the Daily Home Screening Tool to assess their child's health every morning. Any student displaying any of the symptoms listed must stay home to protect the safety and wellbeing of others. While at school, if your child reports to the clinic exhibiting one of the symptoms on the screening tool, parents will be called to pick up their child and they must stay home until symptom free for 24 hours. Please continue to send your student to school with a clean face covering, a spare mask stored in a baggie in the bookbag, and a refillable water bottle each day. Students are required to wear a face covering at school during all times that social distancing is not possible.

Thank you for your support with our new arrival and dismissal procedures. Everything has been going smoothly, thanks to your support. The procedures are clearly outlined in our Open House videos located on our website, should you want to review them again. Parents of "walkers" must remain off campus at arrival and dismissal times and cannot congregate in the courtyard, in front of building 1, or on the walkways. Plan to meet at a location off campus or change your child to a car rider and drive through the car line each day. We thank you in advance for your cooperation in these matters.

School Pictures

Next week is School Picture Day on September 9th. We are using a new photographer this year, Focused on Forever, for those attending school traditionally. We have scheduled a picture day for any family whose child is attending My School Online. That date is scheduled on October 20th. Details to schedule your child for a picture will be coming out prior to that date. We use these photos for our annual Yearbook, please know that all students must be in DRESS CODE for this picture day.

Home School Communication & My School Online

It is very important that your parent contact information is up to date, including email addresses and phone numbers, as this is this primary means of communication from school to home. This year, all flyers for the week will be posted virtually on the school website and Facebook on Wednesdays. If your child attends school traditionally and would like a paper copy of all notices, please be sure to complete your teacher's form. You will also need to indicate if you need a paper copy of a progress report as well. All students in My School Online must use a laptop with camera capabilities; in this environment a smart phone will not suffice. If you need a laptop and have not checked one out, they are available to all students.

Changes to Dismissal/PikMyKid

This year we have started to use a new dismissal management system called PikMyKid. We hope you have all downloaded the App, registered in the system, and practiced a little. If your child is a car rider, please place the PikMyKid Car Tag on your visor to show each day as you enter the line. This year, dismissal changes can be made through our new PikMyKid app or by calling the school up until 3:15 each day. Changes can only be made by a parent and students cannot be picked up early after 3:15 each day.
