Social Emotional Learning

The Social Emotional topic for this month is citizenship. After long periods of remote learning, our classroom communities have never been more relevant as spaces to foster social belonging and prepare our learners as active citizens. This environment can be created in our classrooms and at home by having opportunities for kids to take responsibility for their behavior as both individuals and members of a community. Students have spent this last month learning about citizenship during their morning meet-up! Ask your child one way they have been a good citizen within our school.

Daily Home Screening Tool & Health/Safety Procedures

As a reminder, parents must use the Daily Home Screening Tool to assess their child's health every morning. Any student displaying any of the symptoms listed must stay home to protect the safety and well-being of others. While at school, if your child reports to the clinic exhibiting one of the symptoms on the screening tool, parents will be called to pick up their child and he/she must stay home until symptom free for 24 hours. A copy of this daily tool can be found at: Microsoft Word - daily HOMEscreening tool 8.19.0 FINAL (stlucie.k12.fl.us) All staff and visitors on campus must wear a mask and complete the self-health screener upon entering. All students must wear a mask unless the family has completed the opt out form. We strongly encourage students to wear masks for the health and safety of all. Please know that if there is a positive case on campus and your student needs to be quarantined for possible exposure, you will be notified by the school. Contact tracing is done following the CDC and DOH guidelines. If someone in your family tests positive for COVID-19 or is awaiting test results, we ask that you please keep your child(ren) at home and contact Mr. Keelor or Mrs. DeGarmo at (772) 345-3245.

Home School Communication & Students on Quarantine

It is very important that your parent contact information is up to date, including email addresses and phone numbers, as this is this primary means of communication from school to home. This year, although flyers for the week will be posted virtually on the school website and Facebook on Wednesdays, you will also receive a paper copy in your child' Wednesday folder. All completed work will also be sent home on Wednesdays in that folder. Please sign and return promptly on Thursday. If your child is on quarantine, they will be offered a laptop to complete work at home on Canvas. Our new Quarantine Support Teachers and your child's classroom teacher(s) will be sure to reach out and have work available for your child during this time.

Guidance Department News

We have four certified school counselors on our campus this year who are specifically trained to help all students in the areas of academic achievement, social-emotional development, and college and career readiness. PikMyKid - Dismissal System & Arrival and Dismissal Procedures

We have had many families transitioning back to traditional school and new families this year and wanted to remind all parents about our dismissal system, PikMyKid, which has been in effect since the beginning of the 20-21 school year. It is expected that all families use our system to ensure a safe and smooth dismissal.

- If you need to change the way your child goes home, you must do so in the PikMyKid app no later than 3:15 (or 1:15 on early dismissal days). Otherwise, your child will be instructed to go to the designated location listed in PikMyKid. If you do not have information about the app, please contact your classroom/homeroom teacher. If you have questions about PikMyKid, you may contact the front office.
- 2. If you are picking up more than your own child(ren), you must "announce" all children you are picking up in the PikMyKid app, so that all the students are alerted in their classrooms and come down to the pick-up location. Be sure to get the numbers from the parent.
- 3. If you are picking up in the car lines (either Gr. 1-8 or Kindergarten), you must display the name and number of your child on your dash or visor from when you arrive on campus until you leave. By doing this, it enables the staff to identify your child easily and check if he/she is announced and dismiss him/her at the end - all of which helps speed up our dismissal process.

Thank you for your support with our arrival and dismissal procedures. Everything has been going smoothly, thanks to your support. As a reminder, parents of "walkers" must remain off campus at arrival and dismissal times and cannot congregate in the courtyard, in front of building 1, or on the walkways. Plan to meet at a location off campus or change your child to a car rider and drive through the car line each day. Our kindergarten car line started off rough but now we ask all families to follow this path daily to get to the car line: Turn on Rowley from the Parkway, take a left on West Park and proceed directly to the car line. When leaving the line, you MUST turn right when exiting. We thank you in advance for your cooperation in these matters.

School Lunch Program

Registration for the **2022-2023** school year is open from September 1, 2020- February 1, 2021. FAU will begin selecting students in March, beginning with Kindergarten. You must apply for the lottery for a new student, even if you already have siblings here at PPE.
