#### **Star and FAST Progress Monitoring 1**

Last week in your Wednesday folders, each grade level received specific letters about our new progress monitoring for grades K-8. The window for the first PM is 8/22-9/21. We began this week with our 7th and 8th graders on Monday, August 29th. The remaining schedule has been placed on our September calendar. Please look for your child(ren)'s specific day(s). All testing takes place in the morning and our teachers are trained and ready to begin. In the near future, parents will be able to access scores through Skyward Family/Student Access. Once it is fully operational, we will communicate this with our families.

#### **Lunch Visits with Families**

We are so happy to be able to offer time for our families to enjoy lunch with their child(ren) again. We ask for you to reserve this time for special occasions only as it is so important students eat with their peers to form bonds with classmates. We will begin the week of September 19 following the schedule below. Please adhere to this schedule, which includes the specific days of the week and grades for who can attend lunch, if you would like to plan lunch with your child. Grades K-3 have 2 designated days per week, and grades 4-8 have 1 designated day per week. All lunches with family will take place in the outside, covered dining area. We do not have alternate seating, so in event of inclement weather, please be sure your child knows you may not be able to join them for lunch. Our cafeteria is at capacity during each lunch and we do not have extra space. All lunch visitors must come in through the front office, stay only for their child's lunch time, and exit through the front office. Gates are not to be used for entrance and/or exit. We appreciate your adherence to these guidelines as we bring this time back for our families.

#### **iSucceed**

We will be implementing a new initiative with the district called iSucceed in Safe and Caring Schools. The goal of this initiative is to provide a safe, secure, and predictable environment for all students and staff, in schools and on buses. Even though the initiative is new, it is comprised of many programs that we are already using at the school including: Multi-Tiered System of Supports (MTSS), Single School Culture, PBIS, and CHAMPS, while incorporating Life Management Skills/Culture & Learning Environment, and Student Success Plans. We are excited to start this initiative this year and will continue provide the best learning environment for all of our Palm Pointe students.

#### **Cultural Learning Environment (CLE)**

This year, Social Emotional Learning (SEL) has transitioned to CLE, or Cultural Learning Environment. Students will continue to participate in morning meetings each day helping them to engage and interact with one another. Additionally, this year, students will make personal goals for themselves with a tracking sheet in their classroom. Using the harmony goals, students can select a personal goal and keep track of their progress throughout the year. In September, our CLE theme will be motivation and agency. Motivation and agency are centered around being self-directed and invested in your own growth in change. You can encourage your child to practice motivation and agency by giving them opportunities to practice responsibility through chores, completing assignments, and setting individual goals. As a school we will celebrate motivation and agency on September 30th.

#### School Advisory Council

The School Advisory Council (SAC) is a team of people representing various segments of the community: parents, teachers, students, administrators, support staff, business/ industry people and other interested community members. SAC members gather to discuss the school's academic plan and progress. They discuss the School Improvement Plan, which is a plan made of goals and objectives established for the school determined by needs. The purpose of the School Improvement Plan is to increase student performance. The SAC committee provides input and feedback on plans and actions that help lead to student achievement and performance.

Parents who want to get involved are encouraged to attend the monthly meeting of the SAC committee. Palm Pointe's SAC meets on the fourth Thursday of the month on campus beginning at 8:45. Meetings generally last from 45 to 60 minutes. If you would like to join, please attend the next SAC meeting on September 22<sup>nd</sup> at 8:45.

#### **Arrival and Dismissal Procedures**

Thank you for your support with our arrival and dismissal procedures. With the exception of the beginning of the year's lengthy dismissals, it has been going smoothly, thanks to your support. As a reminder, parents of "walkers" must remain off campus at arrival and dismissal times and cannot congregate in the courtyard, in front of building 1, or on the walkways. Plan to meet at a location off campus or change your child to a car rider and drive through the car line each day. We strongly encourage you to join our car rider lines if your child does not walk all the way home. Please be respectful of our surrounding neighbors and do not park on the street while waiting for your child. Law Enforcement can ticket you for this. This is most often observed on East Park Ave. We thank you in advance for your cooperation in these matters. Please use our dismissal system, PikMyKid, for all your dismissal needs. If you do not have the app downloaded yet, please contact your child's homeroom teacher or the front office and we can assist.

#### **REGISTRATION for 2023-2024**

Registration for the **2023-2024** school year is open from September 1, 2022- February 1, 2023. FAU will begin selecting students in March, beginning with Kindergarten. You must apply for the lottery for a new student each year, even if you already have siblings here at PPE.
