#### **Cold Weather Clause**

When the temperature falls  $50^{\circ}$  or below K-5 students may wear dress code jeans, slacks or school approved skirt with leggings under.

#### McKinney Vento Homeless Act McKinney Vento Homeless Act

If you lost your housing due to economic hardship, natural disaster, or other similar reason, and are living temporarily with friends or relatives, or in a shelter, motel, vehicle, or campground; or on the street; or in an abandoned building, then you are eligible to receive services provided under the McKinney-Vento Act. Regardless of your housing status, every child has the right to an education and additional services must be provided by the school. #### **Book Fair**

The "Bookaneer Book Fair" has sailed off into the sunset, leaving behind many happy readers. The media staff would like to thank all those students, parents, teachers and community members who visited the book fair and found books to take home for their very own. We sold over \$12,000.00 worth of materials during the nine days of the fair including the \$5.00 vouchers provided to more than 700 students for their participation in the summer reading program. 58 books were purchased by individuals for their teachers' classrooms through the Classroom Wish List program and \$152.00 was raised by All for Books donations to purchase an additional 27 books for classrooms. That total will be matched by Scholastic to help three national literacy organizations, as well!
