Clarification of Current Policies

In order to ensure a safe and caring school community, we want to ask that all families read the clarifications on current policies provided below. We ask that you adhere to these policies and respect our staff, whose job it is to enforce them. We appreciate your support!

School Lunch Program

We still have a large number of families that have never applied to the School Lunch Program. We need every Rocket family to fill out an online application. There are significant financial benefits to the school associated with this program. A flyer will be coming home to those families that have yet to apply for the 2017-2018 school year. We appreciate your help and support in applying to help our school!

Early Pick Up

Please be sure that anyone who you want to pick up your child is on your emergency contact list. We ask that you send a note in that morning. We cannot allow a phone call for this process. If you do call, we will request that you send in an email /fax to verify before we allow your child to go home. We must have something in writing in order for anyone on the emergency contact list to pick up your child. If that person is not on the list, when you send your note, request that they be added.

Drop Off and Dismissal

As a courtesy, we want to remind you that it is against the law to stop your car in the road to load or unload your child. Signs are posted. PSL Police have been monitoring and will be giving out tickets. Please also refrain from parking in areas designated as 'No Parking' in neighboring streets. Many parents walk up to school to get their "walker," but are parked illegally in the neighborhood. Many are stopped on the street, not in a parking spot, or are parked where it clearly states 'No Parking.' We try to cause minimal disruption to our neighbors and we ask that you adhere to these guidelines and rules of the road.

Lunch

Parents are always welcome but visitors are not permitted to eat at the student's lunch table. Only your own child may have lunch with you. We ask that you limit your visits for special occasions so students have opportunities to socialize and eat lunch with their classmates. Please sign in at the front office and receive a visitor's pass. If you are giving permission for extended family or friends to have lunch with your child, a note must be sent to the front office prior to the lunch date, even if they are on your emergency contact list.

Data Verification

Data Verification forms will be sent home soon. All forms need to be signed and returned, even if no changes need to be made. If there are changes, please write directly on the form. If you have an address change, please attach a copy of a utility bill or proof of residency. We strive for accurate data for all students and this form enables us to have the most current emergency and contact information. Please pay careful attention to who you designate as an emergency contact and correctly mark whether or not that person has permission to pick up your child. Please mark YES or NO for each person on the card.

Attendance Matters!

Family vacations are not automatically excused absences and cannot exceed 5 days annually. Students must have fewer than 10 unexcused or 5 excused absences in order for any vacation request to be considered. Also taken into consideration are the student's attendance and academic history, mastery of the curriculum, and reason for travel. Please try and schedule family vacations during designated school vacation time. Please also consider that if a student misses just 2 days a month that adds up to missing 10% of the school year! School attendance counts! Every time a child enters late or is picked up early, not only does it disrupt their education, but it disrupts the teacher and entire class. Please continue to refrain from having your child arrive late or from picking him/her up early. Please be reminded that 5 tardies and/or 5 early pickups in a nine week period will result in 1 unexcused absence.

<u>iPad News for *i-Ready*</u> Curriculum Associates has made significant instructional content available for use on iPads. By 2018, content will be available on iPads, Chromebooks, <u>and</u> computers. The *i-Ready* app is designed to work on iPads that are compatible with iOS 10.0, such as the iPad 4, iPad Air, iPad Air 2, iPad Pro, and the new iPad model released by Apple in 2017. iPad minis and iPhones are not supported by *i-Ready* at this time. Students accessing *i-Ready* lessons from home now have multiple options. School access will be through laptop or desktop computers.
