Dear Palm Pointe Families,

The month of September proved to be a busy month. We hope all our families are back to a regular routine after Hurricane Irma. At school, we have returned to a regular schedule and have rescheduled all events that were missed during our days off. As you know by now, we are having a full day of school on September 27th and October 27th is now a school day for our students.

We had our first Citizen of the Month assembly, where we honored many students who have followed the school-wide expectations and consistently demonstrated efficacy and effort. i-Ready

Students are completing their diagnostics in both reading and math. Once they are complete, an individualized instructional path will be designed for them. The lessons complement what is being taught in the classroom. It provides differentiated instruction to meet your child's individual needs.

How does my child navigate i-Ready? Open an internet browser. Go to *login.i-ready.com*. Students use their "56" number as the username, and their lunch number as the password; select Florida and click go. Select either reading or math. The My Progress box records the lessons completed and the score. Click on Start Lessons to begin.

What will my child gain by using this at home? Any time that your child works on i-Ready lessons will enhance his/her classroom learning. Additionally, for kindergarten through second grade students, working on i-Ready reading lessons can be counted as a 100 Book Challenge step for each fifteen minutes they are in the program.
