Based on the *Home Language Survey* that was completed in the registration packet, some kindergarten students will be given the IPT assessment (Oral Language Proficiency Test). Collaboration with Riverdeep Immersion Subject English in China

Riverdeep Immersion Subject English (RISE) is one of the premier children's English learning companies in China. RISE is a subsidiary of Beijing Riverdeep international Education Technology Ltd, a Chinese-Foreign Equity Joint Venture and a leading private educational services in China. Riverdeep International Education LTD is a subsidiary of Houghton Mifflin Harcourt, and as such is the only company in China licensed to use HMH's educational resources. The company offers a range of educational programs, products and services focused on subject-based children's English learning. This International Education Program is on the cutting edge of all English learning programs in China. Using English as the language of instruction, the program combines subject knowledge acquisition learning with opportunities for practicing core competency skills, fundamental and unique skills, which enable people to become successful competitors and leaders in the international working environment.

In January of 2012, a group of RISE Headmasters visited Palm Pointe. They were able to observe and collaborate with teachers and staff focusing on the promotion of Sino-US educational cooperation and communication which would foster the development of both schools and develop quality leaders of Subject English Education.

Miss Snyder, Mrs. Perez and 2 additional SLCSB employees spoke at Tsinghua University at a conference that was help in August of 2013 in China as well as speak at the Sino-US Principal's Summit on the "Cultivation of Global Talents Subject English Education Summit". They were able to discuss the differences between Chinese and American education and collaborate on how to prepare our children to become international leaders. While in China, they were also able to address and observe teachers in different RISE centers. RISE specializes in English Immersion and impacts over 20,000 students in over 28 centers throughout China.

While at Palm Pointe, in January, 2014, RISE began planning a Summer Institute where Palm Pointe teachers teach RISE students creating an "American" classroom in China. This became a reality in July. Four of Palm Pointe's teachers (Mrs. Rudzinski, Ms. Keys, Ms. Clancy and Mrs. Kuba), along with their 5 children spent 2 weeks teaching in Beijing and Shanghai. They were able to use American curriculum to teach reading, science, history and math as well as share the most effective teaching strategies with the RISE teachers. On top of the time spent teaching, they were able able to visit some of the great Chinese wonders such as the Great Wall of China, the Beijing and Shanghai Zoo as well as the Terracotta Warriors.

Our teachers have returned from China with new knowledge and unique experiences. This collaboration will allow those teachers to help others begin to actively teach about Chinese culture in their own classroom and allow for cross-curricular development of lessons and units. One of the goals is to learn how to improve relationships and strengthen school-community connections with all cultures and share that with faculty, staff, stakeholders and the community.

CHAMPS

This year all of Palm Pointe is using a new classroom management system call CHAMPS. It is a positive approach to classroom management because it teaches students the expectations for all activities they will do throughout the day. There are 5 components to CHAMPS. Each letter of the word CHAMPS is a reminder of how students are expected to behave. The "C" reminds students of the voice level they can use for the activity. The "H" tells students how to ask for help when they need it. The "A" stands for the type of activity they will be doing. The "M" lets students know if they can move during the activity and for what purpose. The "P" reminds students what it looks like if they are fully participating. When students comply with all of the rules and procedures, the "S" stands for the SUCCESS they will experience! When students meet the CHAMPS expectations the teacher lets them know they are doing a good job by praising them and providing Rocket Fuel which students can use to "buy" incentives. When students don't follow an expectation, the teacher corrects the infraction and reminds the student of what needs to be done. Consequences are imposed if the infractions continue. Talk to your student about the CHAMPS expectations. He/She will be able to tell you more about them. If you have any questions about CHAMPS, you can ask your child's teacher.
