Grade Level News

Second Grade - Wow! Can you believe it is January already? We are heading into the 3rd nine weeks of school. As of now, students will be reading all district unit tests in ELA and math on their own. In math, we will be working on place value within 1000 and addition and subtraction within 1000. We will also be sharpening up our comprehension strategies, as well as learning how to read passages and answering questions on our own. In science, we will be learning about motion, Earth structures, Earth systems, and patterns. We are looking forward to a great 3rd quarter!

Third Grade - Third grade ended 2018 with a wonderful holiday party!! As we enter the New Year, we will continue to learn about Maps & Globes. We will learn about all the various maps and their purpose, as well as how to use them. We will focus on fine tuning our grammatical skills through a focused language and editing task each week. In math, all students will focus on memorizing their multiplication facts at a greater speed. Each week they will focus on a multiple and earn part of their sundae for the Ice Cream Sundae Party we will have on March 25th! Be on the lookout for a flyer that will contain resources to aide in assisting your child at home. In January, we will learn all about fractions with a denominator of 2, 3, 4, 6, & 8. All of the Third Grade Teachers wish you a prosperous and joyous New Year!

Fourth Grade - Fourth grade has been learning about how the Seminole Indians are strong people and used their environment to their advantage. They have also been discovering theme and main idea in Reading. In the world of math, students are comparing decimals and fractions. Our new writing focus is staying on topic!

In math, we will be working on adding and subtracting fractions, comparing fractions and decimals, and multiplying fractions. Make sure you know your multiplication facts! In science, we will continue studying motion.

Fifth Grade - In Fifth Grade, we are very excited to welcome our students back in 2019! In lanuary, our focus in math is geometry, with a focus on two-dimensional shapes. In science, we will explore Earth systems and patterns, including how climate zones effect weather and the water cycle. In reading, we will be supporting the science curriculum and reading text focused on earth systems. In writing, our January target is maintaining the correct focus throughout their entire essay.

Gifted / High Achieving - Third

through fifth GHA is going up, up, and away! In Reading, we are comparing two texts, and looking at point of view for all grades! In math, third grade will understand concepts of area and be able to relate area to multiplication (PLEASE KEEP WORK-ING ON FLUENCY) and to addition. Fourth grade will learn how to add and subtract fractions. Fifth grade will word with two dimensional shapes and understanding how to classify them, Finally, our scientists are studying about air and space, so we will culminate this unit with a field trip to the Kennedy Space Center in January!

School Uniforms We know you have a choice in St. Lucie County and we are excited you chose Rivers Edge for your student's elementary education! We appreciate you supporting our mandatory uniform dress code. Rivers Edge Elementary uniform dress code policy reflects pride and unity and demonstrates that school is a place to study and learn. The proven benefits of a uniform dress code include: increased focus on teaching and learning; reduced distraction, peer pressure, and behavioral issues; strengthened school pride, and improved school safety. We believe that the school's climate will enable each student to experience personal success and develop into lifelong learners.

The following is the uniform dress code for the upcoming 2018-2019 school year. If it is not listed below, then it is NOT acceptable to wear to school.

Shirts	Short or long sleeved, collared polo or button down shirts in solid white,		
	navy blue, light blue or hunter green. Logos not larger than 1" (size of a		
	quarter). Shirts must be tucked in at all time while on campus.		
Shorts & Pants	Traditional style uniform shorts in solid navy blue, khaki or REE plaid. No		
	jeans. No cargo shorts or pants. Shorts can NOT be shorter than		
	fingertip length. All bottoms (pants, shorts, skorts) should be worn at		
	the waist. If pants, shorts or skorts have belt loops, a belt must be		
	worn.		
Capris, Skirts, Skorts,	Solid navy blue, khaki or REE plaid. Must be knee length. NOT to be		
Jumpers (Girls), Polo	shorter than fingertip length. Uniform style jumpers & polo style dresses		
Dresses	only.		
Sweatshirts, Cardigans,	Solid white, navy blue, light blue or hunter green – can have a hood if it		
Sweaters	has a zippered front. School logo sweatshirts sold through PTO are		
	permissible. All sweatshirts and sweaters must have a uniform		
	appropriate shirt worn underneath with collar showing.		
Shoes	Enclosed athletic (sneakers) and no-heeled, enclosed dress shoes. No		
	boots of any style, flip flops, or sandals of any style.		
Leggings, socks, tights	If leggings are worn, they must be worn under school approved clothing.		
	Socks SHOULD be worn for health reasons.		
Belts	Solid leather or cloth colored belt is acceptable in school colors, REE		
	plaid, black or brown.		
Ties	REE plaid, solid white, navy blue, light blue or hunter green.		
Grooming	Natural colored hair; Small head bands, bows and clips in any color;		
	Small jewelry (earrings and necklaces); due to possible health issues		
	cologne, perfumes and strong smelling soaps are not allowed.		
PTO items	Any clothing sold through PTO is permissible to wear on any day.
