
Media with Mrs. Pittman

Grade Level News



Off we go to Kindergarten! The Kindergarten Teachers welcome their students and families to Rivers Edge Elementary. August has

been a time for making new friends and getting adjusted to the daily routine. In Reading, the students are discussing about their favorite things by drawing pictures inside a circle map. They are also talking about different kinds of feelings. Numbers are all around us. Our Kindergartners see numbers on their name tags, bus tags, lunch tags, and on the calendar. In Math, our students are learning to recognize the number, count the objects, and write the number.



What a great start to the new school year. First grade students have been busy meeting new friends, building new relationships, and catching up with friends from Kindergarten. We have

started the SFA reading program, so please don't forget to sit with your child and work through the Read and Respond homework every school night. Math has re-introduced 2 dimensional shapes. Take a walk around your house and have your child name some 2D shapes that they see.



In second grade, we have just finished up 2nd iReady testing for math and reading. We **** are now working on small group instruction for Reading. We are learning how to

ask and answer questions, compare stories, and using context clues. In math, we have been working on one and two-step word problems, place value, and adding and subtracting within 20. Please continue to read with your child at home each night!



Third grade is off to a great start. We kicked off the year reviewing adding & subtracting. We will be moving into multiplication in the next couple of weeks. Currently we are

learning all about our civil duties and the branches & levels of government. We are super excited to start our next unit in 2 weeks on the practices of science. We will learn about the roles of both scientists and engineers. We have some awesome activities planned!!!! If you haven't already done so, please reach out to your child's teacher and ask for the code to their Class Tag. We are looking forward to a super spectacular September!



Fourth Grade is off to a fabulous start this year. During the first week of school we practiced rules and expectations, talked a great deal about kindness and citizenship and learned how to be a successful caring member of the community. Now that procedures are un-

der way we are tackling place value in Math and learning how scientists investigate the world around them through Reading, Writing, Science, and hands on application. We are also learning new academic vocabulary and making connections in learning.



Hello from the 5th Grade team!! A lot is going on with us, so here are a few items to get started with: Sea World permission slips

are being sent home with a slight difference from the previous year; The monthly payments are now \$20 per month which hopefully we will get more attendees. Smelly pencils will be on sale in the cafeteria in the morning within the next couple of weeks. We will be asking students to eat breakfast first before standing in line to purchase a pencil. Finally, Safety Patrol applications were sent home with students last week and Mr. Madden in collaboration with 5th Grade Teachers will select students who demonstrate leadership and follow all Rivers Edge Expectations.

Gifted / High Achieving Team

Content and writing is busy!

Third grade is learning about Government and Civic Participation. We've been exploring about civic virtues and how they can be a good citizen in their communities!



Fourth grade is learning about the Practice of Science. We've learned about how science and engineering build on each other and about the types of variables used in experiments. Fifth grade is learning about the Nature of Science. We've been learning about hurricanes, how they form, and what makes them so dangerous.

Our mathematicians are working overtime!

All classes will round up their first units in September. 3rd grade will understand place value and be able to use place value to add and subtract whole number. Unit 2 will be working with multiplication. Please begin building fluency by practicing your multiplication facts each night.

4th graders will be able to multiply and divide multi-digit whole numbers. Unit 2 begins with working on numerical expressions which are all 5th grade standards. This will include following the order of operations (PEMDAS).

5th grade will be able to perform operations on multi-digit numbers. Unit 2 will include multiplying and dividing fractions within word problems.

Our reading wizards are magical!

In 3rd grade, we will be learning about main idea and context clues. 4th graders will be learning about point of view and how it can differ. 5th graders will be learning about poetry and figurative language.
