<p style="text-align: center;"><b><u>SHIRTS/TOPS</u></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ All collared shirts must have sleeves</li> <li>➤ Collared Shirts (solid, stripes &amp; plaids without printed words or pictures embroidered on them)</li> <li>➤ Shirts must be tucked in at all times</li> <li>➤ Shirts must be long enough to remain tucked in when seated</li> <li>➤ Spirit Shirts can be worn any day</li> </ul>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b><u>SHIRTS/TOPS</u></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ Shirts that are collarless</li> <li>➤ Shirts that are not tucked in</li> <li>➤ Shirts that are tight fitting, revealing or sleeveless</li> <li>➤ Sweaters with hood on inside</li> <li>➤ Shirt has graphics larger than pocket size</li> </ul>
<p style="text-align: center;"><b><u>PANTS/BOTTOMS</u></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ Shorts, Pants, Capris, Jumpers, Collared Dresses are permitted (tights are permitted underneath)</li> <li>➤ Fitted at the waist</li> <li>➤ Extend beyond the fingertips</li> <li>➤ Denim jeans are allowed</li> <li>➤ Must be securely fastened above the hip bone</li> </ul>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b><u>PANTS/BOTTOMS</u></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ Pants that have holes or are torn</li> <li>➤ Pants that have embellishments/designs</li> <li>➤ Sweat pants, athletic shorts, spandex</li> <li>➤ Pants that are baggy</li> <li>➤ Pants that display visible underwear</li> <li>➤ Belt buckles larger than 2 inches</li> </ul>
<p style="text-align: center;"><b><u>SHOES</u></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ Must have closed toe</li> <li>➤ Closed toe must have a back or back strap</li> <li>➤ All closed toe straps/laces must be properly fastened</li> </ul>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b><u>SHOES</u></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ Flip Flops/Sandals</li> <li>➤ Clogs/Crocs</li> <li>➤ Shoes with wheels/lights</li> </ul>
<p style="text-align: center;"><b><u>OUTERWEAR</u></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ Sweatshirts, Sweaters, jackets and pullovers in any color</li> <li>➤ Hoods (must be removed once inside the building)</li> <li>➤ Collared shirts must be worn underneath all outerwear</li> </ul>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b><u>OUTERWEAR</u></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ Inappropriate or obscene pictures</li> <li>➤ Camouflage</li> <li>➤ Graphics</li> </ul>
<p style="text-align: center;"><b><u>HEAD ATTIRE/HAIR/JEWELRY</u></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ <b>Natural hair color only</b></li> <li>➤ Headbands of any solid color (Girls)</li> <li>➤ Earrings 2 inches or smaller</li> <li>➤ Piercings appropriate for school</li> <li>➤ Hair color, hair styles, hair accessories &amp; jewelry should be appropriate to school setting &amp; must not distract the learning environment</li> </ul>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b><u>HEAD ATTIRE/HAIR/JEWELRY</u></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ Caps, hats, bandanas</li> <li>➤ Hoods are not to be worn on the head</li> <li>➤ Spray painting or dyeing of hair</li> <li>➤ Inappropriate and/or distracting images or writing or designs through the shaving of a head is not permitted</li> <li>➤ Inappropriate press on tattoos</li> </ul>

**Dress Code Violations:**

- 1<sup>st</sup> Violation:** Teacher will conference with student and contact parent and document the conference in student planner. Teacher will send a copy of the dress code policy with violation highlighted.
- 2<sup>nd</sup> Violation:** Teacher will make parent phone call and document it in the student planner.
- 3<sup>rd</sup> Violation:** Teacher will schedule parent conference and document it in the student planner. Referral will be submitted by the teacher to administration.

**Consequences for being out of Dress Code after the 1<sup>st</sup> Referral will be handled in the following manner:**

- 1<sup>st</sup> Referral** Lunch Detention for a day
- 2<sup>nd</sup> Referral** Elementary Students - Mandatory Parent Conference with the Teacher, and Lunch Detention
- Middle School Students – Mandatory Parent Conference with the Homeroom Teacher
- 3<sup>rd</sup> Referral** Elementary Students – One day of In-School Suspension  
Middle School Students – One day of In-School Suspension
- 4<sup>th</sup> Referral** Mandatory conference with an administrator or dean for the consequences to be determined
