# The Indian River Lagoon Science Festival is holding satellite events throughout the Treasure Coast.

What do a tour of a world-famous orange juice plant, a paddle through Florida's history, and a plant sale by Florida Master Gardeners have in common? They're all part of five weeks of satellite events leading up to the fifth annual Indian River Lagoon Science Festival! The satellite events celebrate the scientist in everyone with S.T.E.A.M. (science, technology, engineering, art and mathematics) programs and activities for a variety of ages and interests. This year's Indian River Lagoon Science Festival takes place on Saturday, October 27 at Veteran's Memorial Park at the River Walk Center in Fort Pierce.

- T** - tell an adult without delay, your response can make a difference

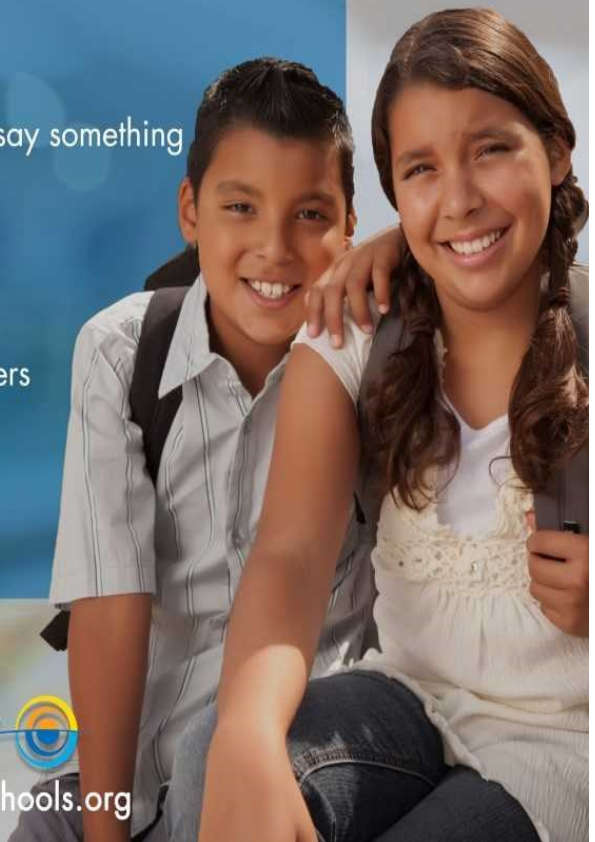
