## **SAC Meeting Notes**

#### September 18, 2018 Meeting Minutes

#### Welcome/Introductions/Attendance

Ms. Hargadine began the meeting at 6:00 PM in room 505A by welcoming everyone followed by introductions.

#### **Review/Approve Minutes from Prior Meeting/August**

\* First motions to approve August SAC Minutes made by Ms. Kinder, second motion made by Mr. Kloser, all were in favor to approve minutes.

#### SIP Reviews/Updates & MTSS (Rtl) Leadership Team Reviews/Updates

\* Ms. Hargadine began updates by speaking about utilizing every opportunity we have to help students succeed.

\* Students need to be able to learn how to set and achieve goals, learn how to feel and show empathy for others, and learn how to manage their emotions.

\* Surveys show that students don't know how to deal with problems, self-awareness, self-management, social decision making, and being responsible. There is a website that St. Lucie schools has created called SELF and it is constantly being updated with socio-emotional learning. Teachers will be receiving training on the socio-emotional Curriculum called Lions Quest and it will be integrated into the curriculum and the school Climate. Sixth and eighth grades will receive instruction through their social studies class and seventh grade will receive instruction through their science classes. \* Parents and teachers gave feedback on the topics that were presented and suggestions were given that they thought would help the students most.

\* Ms. Hargadine reviewed the SIP Plan and stated that we are a B school. The state asked schools to look at early warning signs and put systems in place to help those who are struggling as well as keep students on track. We are on par with the district.

#### Budget

We continue to utilize our Title 1 monies and explain to the state and federal government what we do with \$170,000 over the 10 months. We continue to offer Before/After School, Saturday Academy School, and Boot Camps.

#### **Open Forum/Discussion**

\* Ms. Hargadine is concerned about our attendance. It is very important that students attend school to learn. We have an action plan in place to help our struggling students grow and make learning gains.

\* We have after school tutoring and academic deans and we did not have to hold back any students last year. We have "boot camps" in place for students to take advantage of to receive some additional experience and practice in the writing areas. We are utilizing i-ready and Reading Plus and students seem to be enjoying these programs. Ms. Mercado asked what makes the 7th grade have higher indicators? Ms. Kinder replied that 7th graders can be impulsive and have a lot of hormones at that age. Ms. Hargadine also added that 7th graders are into their social life at this developmental stage. Ms. Minarchick responded saying that our resource officers are now making home visits. Ms. Hargadine and Ms. Minarchick will also be making house calls for attendance in the future.

\* We will look at our past data and create activities so learning gains can be made for all students at every level. We did add a 6th grade math coach funded out of Title I. We also did a five-day advanced planning before the beginning of the school year. We also are using a new technique called ACES across the grades to help improve writing.

\* Studies haves shown, stated Ms. Hargadine, that students do better learning algebra in middle school. So, we are using new strategies to help students make algebra learning gains.

\* This is the first year that our 8th graders will take the PSAT. Kahn Academy offers PSAT prep and will help a student grow at least 2 years if you use the prep class for at least a year. We are utilizing this program and the PSAT test will let a student know if they are on track to graduate from high school and college. High schools also use the results for advance placement in high school classes.

\* Ms. Minarchick defined PBIS and how it is two-fold: to reduce undesirable behaviors and embed the rules and expectations of our program to reduce the number of referrals. She is very passionate and excited about implementing the program. Hawk bills are school currency where students can use the bills to purchase supplies and goodies at the PBIS store. Every month we will have an activity for PBIS. Mrs. Mercado asked if all the events were during the school day and Mrs. Minarchick said yes, except for Parents Day Out. PBIS also has a bulletin board in each hallway that is for good calls home and the names of teachers go into a drawing.

\* Mrs. Mercado volunteered to be our SAC president for the year and Mrs. Christman volunteered to be our DAC representative.

#### **Next Meeting**

\* The next SAC/PTO meeting is scheduled for October 17, 2018.

\* Meeting adjourned at 7:30 PM with first motion given by Ms. Kinder and seconded by Louisa Saget.
