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DRESS CODE FOR STUDENTS

Students MUST wear:

<u>Collared, turtle neck</u>, or <u>official school spirit shirts purchased from the school</u>. Logos/graphics on shirts other than school spirit shirts may be no larger than pocket-sized

Dresses, shorts, skirts, or skirt slits at knee length or below. Necklines on dresses must stay above arm pit level

Pants, shorts, or skirts worn above the hipbone

Shoes, tennis shoes, or sandals with a back strap, boots

Students Must NOT Wear:

House slippers in any form or clothing that is pajama type in nature

Anything that exposes undergarments or is see-through or sheer in nature, or is tight and revealing Anything that has holes, tears or frays of any kind.

Clothing, accessories, bandanas, jewelry or flags associated with gangs or referencing drugs, tobacco, alcohol, weapons, violence, or sex. The only acceptable flag is the United States Flag (Stars and Stripes)

Accessories that create a safety concern (wallet chains, studded necklaces, wrist bands, rings, hair picks, large combs)

T-shirts, tank tops, or halter tops over collared shirts. Long shirts that go past mid hip-bone

Leggings, jeggings, athletic shorts/pants, board shorts, or sweatpants, including Nike or Adidas-style sweat pants and "joggers"

Hoodies may be worn, but must be size appropriate and may not extend past the hips, or be cut off as a "Half-hoodie."

Hats of any type

Flip Flops or backless shoes

**The school's administration/designee shall be the final judge of wearing apparel/accessories and will determine whether or not such items are appropriate, disruptive, offensive, distracting, or in violation of health and safety rules.

Castle HIGH HOPES Program

CASTLE offers a High Hopes for Kids Program at our school. This program is for students experiencing divorce or separation. Groups take place during the regular school hours and the times are coordinated with the school guidance counselor and your child's teacher. Divorce is one of the most traumatic and life changing events for children. Students who are registered participate in a group with 4-8 students. The program offers the students the opportunity to discuss chances in the family, anger management, communicating feelings, problem-solving and self-esteem. The program runs for 12 sessions and is evidence-based.

CASTLE provides a workbook for each child and a parent workbook for you to see what your child is actually learning in the program. The registration fee is \$25. If you cannot pay the fee, we accept a small donation. There are forms available in the main office. If you have any questions contact Sara Frahm, Program Coordinator, at 772-461-0863, ext. 504.
