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

CHOOSING ELECTIVES

Band and Drama REQUIRE signatures from Mr. Hoce and/or Ms. Pye. Please arrange to meet with Mr. Hoce or Ms. Pye for classes that require an audition.

Musical Theatre – must commit to a full year and after school practices. Student will not be permitted to drop the course during the school year

Leadership class will require an application that must be turned into Ms. Connell (J107)

If you are approved for a Curriculum transfer, you MUST request that course

You are NOT allowed to take a class twice for credit

NJROTC – must wear a uniform once a week and after school practices are part of the program.

Chosen electives WILL NOT be changed

Do not request a course that has a prerequisite that you have not met.
