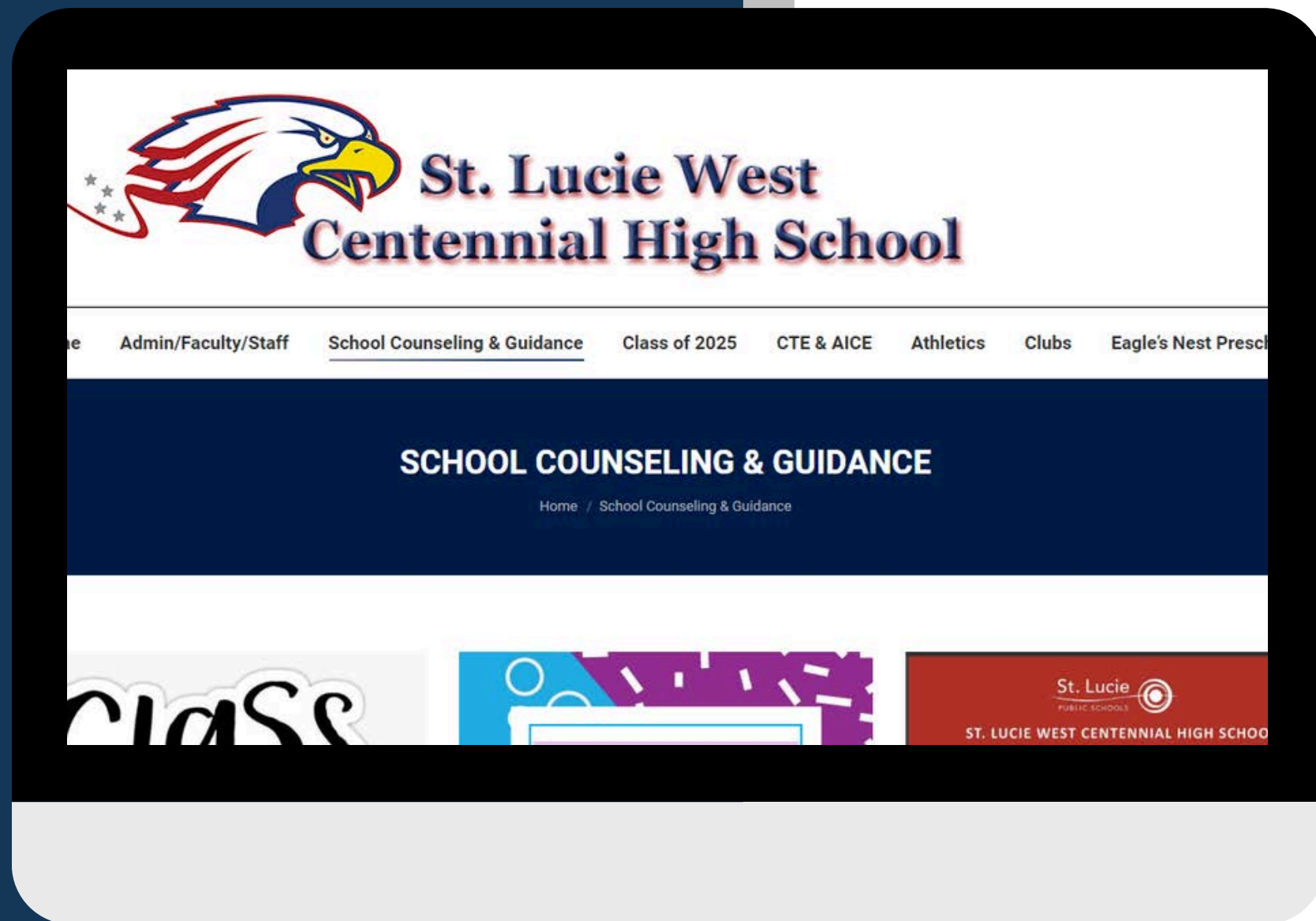

Senior Privilege

DUAL ENROLLMENT/SENIOR PRIVILEGE POLICY

ST. LUCIE WEST CENTENNIAL HIGH SCHOOL POLICY FOR STUDENTS WITH LESS THAN 7 CLASSES ON CAMPUS

The requirements for students wanting this privilege are as follows:

- Senior privilege students must have a 2.0 unweighted Cumulative/Core GPA and be on track for graduation.
- Senior must have previously received an acceleration point or currently be enrolled in an acceleration course/CTE Certification course.
- Dual enrollment students must have a 3.0 unweighted cumulative GPA and pass the PERT test.
- Must have transportation that allows them to arrive late or leave early.
- Must have a schedule with consecutive classes and no gaps between classes.
- Must turn in this signed notarized parental consent form to their School Counselor.
- May not transport other students during school hours.
- Per school board policy students may not take more than 7 classes total per semester (SLWCHS, IRSC, FLVS).

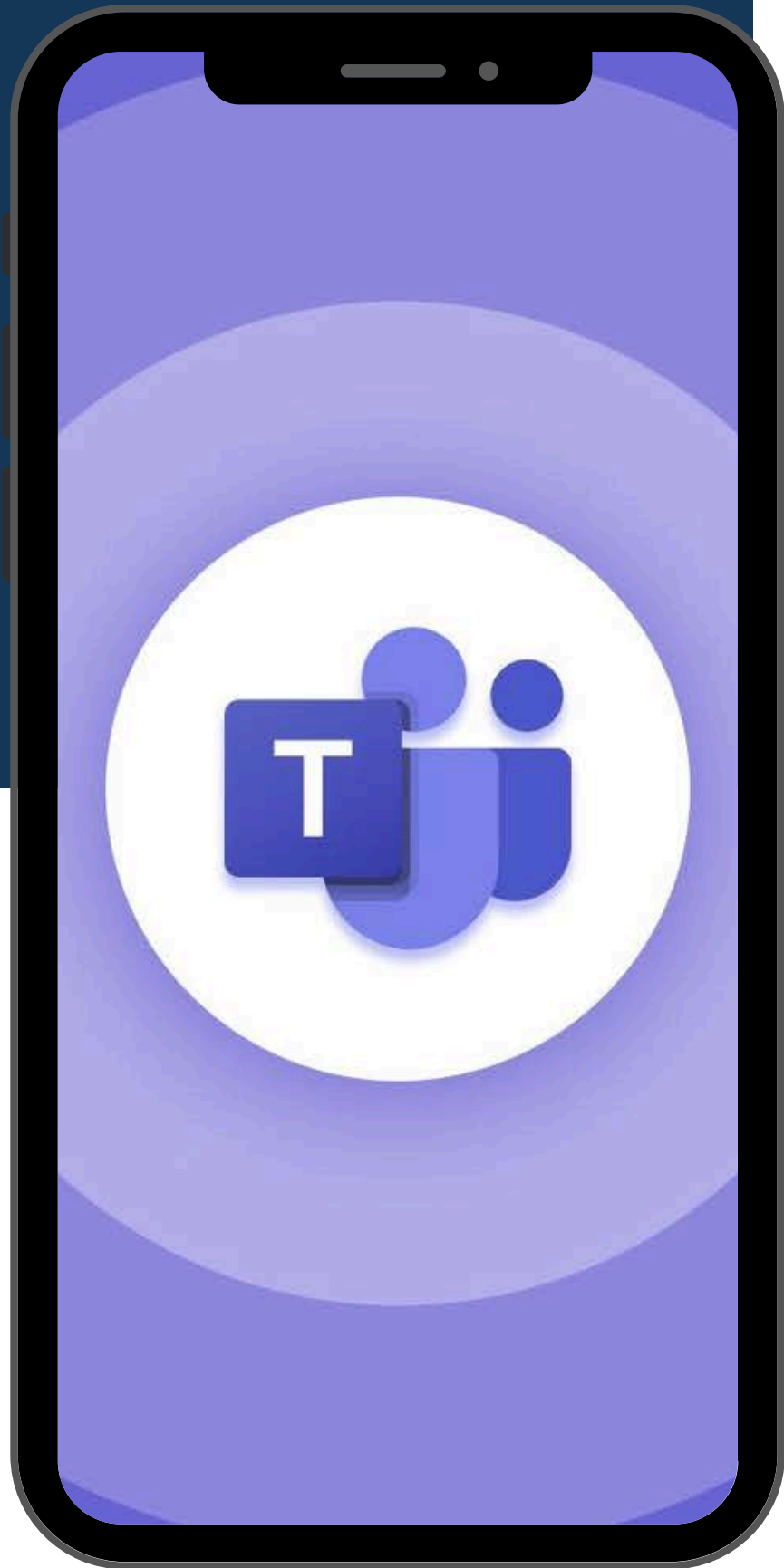

Dual Enrollment for High School Students

Home / Programs / Dual Enrollment for High School Students

The Indian River State College Dual Enrollment program allows eligible public, charter, private and home education students to simultaneously earn high school credit (toward their high school diploma) and credit toward an Associate Degree or career training certificate for an eligible course.

Through IRSC Dual Enrollment, eligible students get a jump on college, saving both time and money. Dual Enrollment students are exempt from application fees, tuition and laboratory fees, and public, charter and home school students receive required textbooks at no charge.

College course materials and class discussions may reflect topics not typically included in secondary courses. College courses will not be modified to accommodate variations in student age and/or maturity. Parents should review the course syllabus before enrolling their student to determine if the content is age appropriate. All IRSC course syllabi may be accessed and reviewed at <https://irsc.simplesyllabus.com/en-US/syllabus-library>.

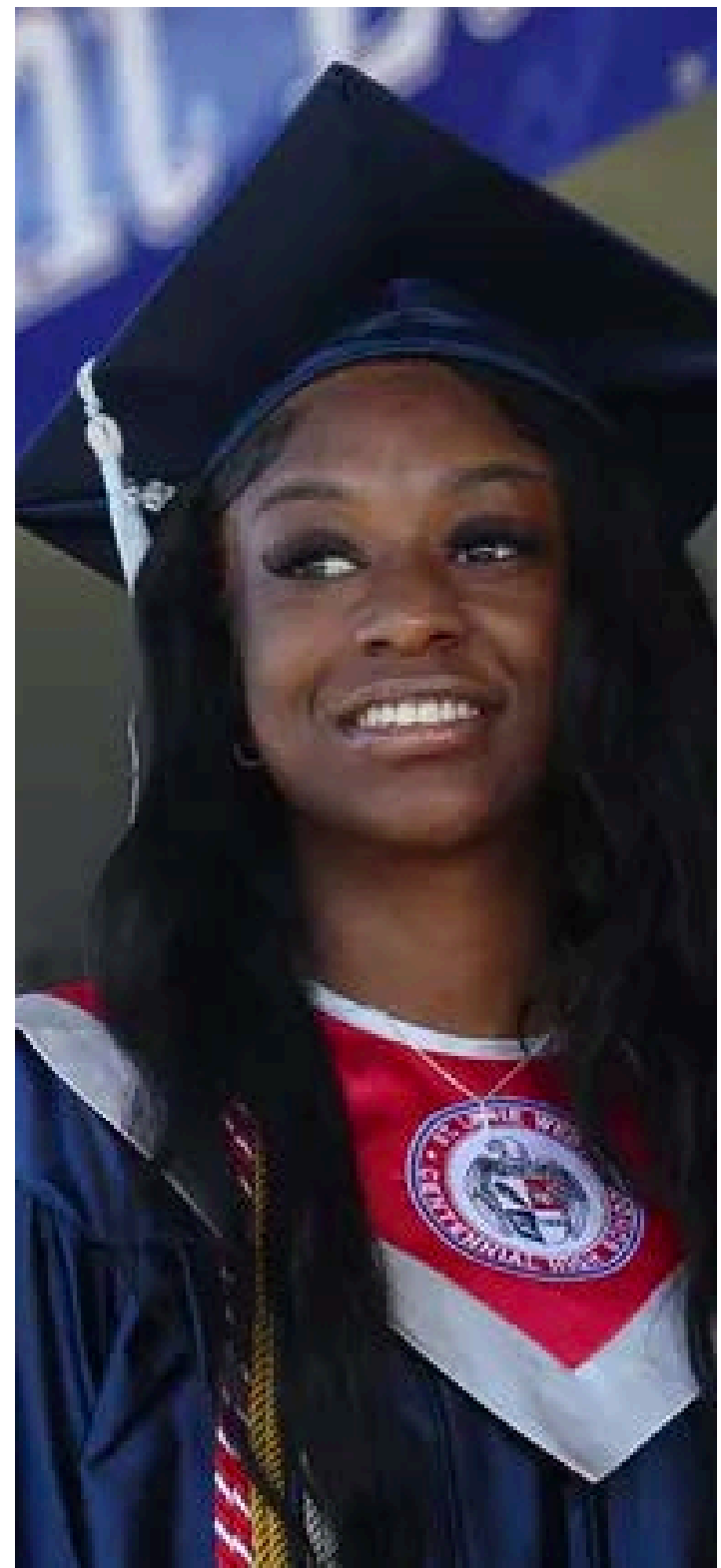

- Start planning college visits for the summer

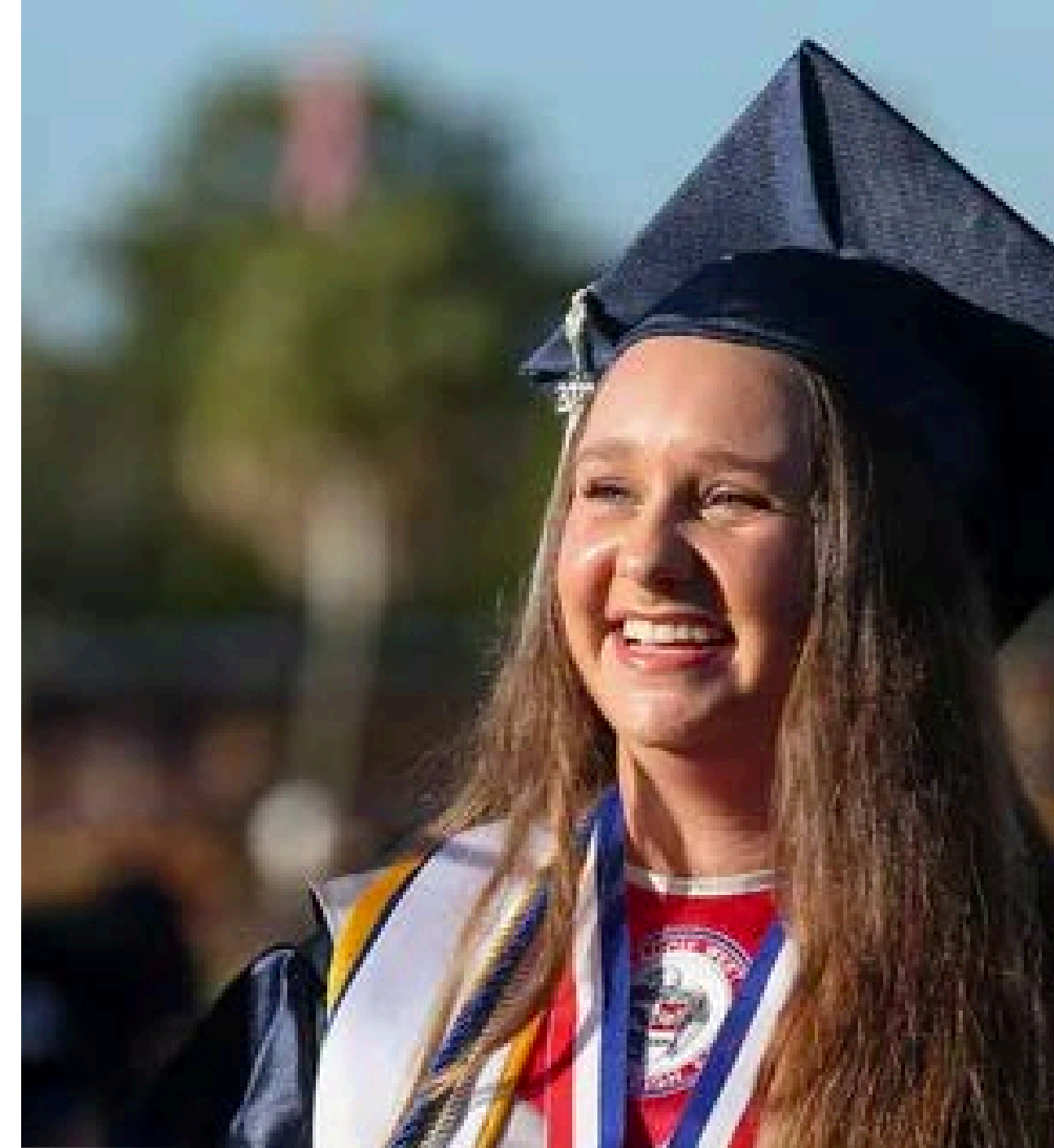

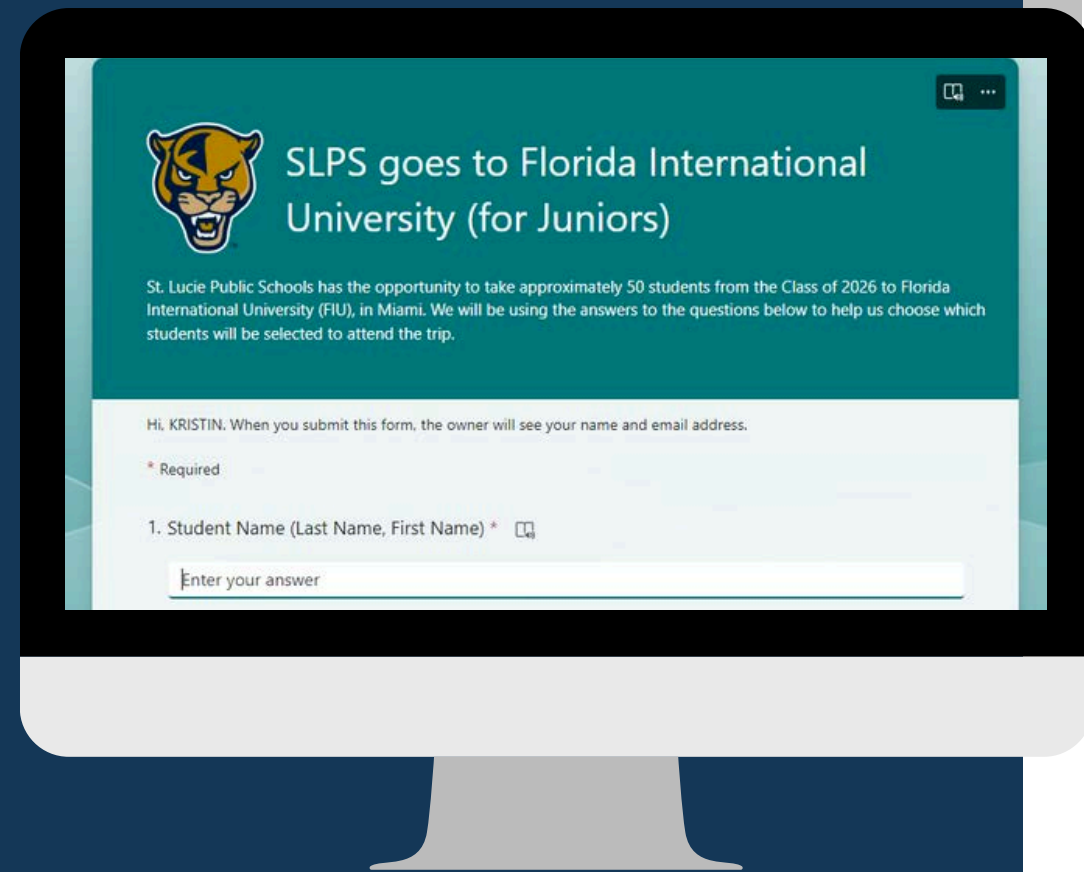
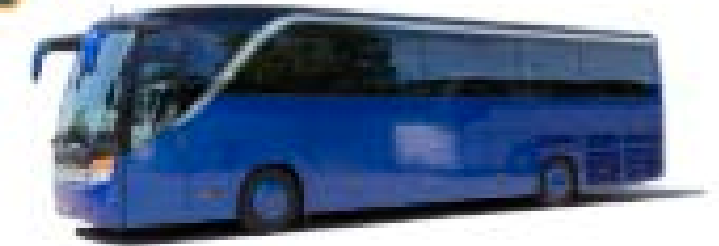

General Requirements & The Basics

1. Florida Resident and U.S. Citizen or eligible noncitizen
2. Earn a standard high school diploma, or its equivalent
3. Not have been found guilty of a felony charge, unless student was granted clemency
4. Be accepted by, and enroll in a degree or certificate program at, an eligible Florida public or independent postsecondary institution.
5. Be enrolled in at least six non-remedial semester credit hours per term
6. The application opens October 1st each year. Students must apply during their senior year.
7. Complete the FFAA (Bright Futures application) no later than August 31st
(Students graduating one semester early and seeking to use funding for that spring semester complete the FFAA no later than December 31st of senior year.)

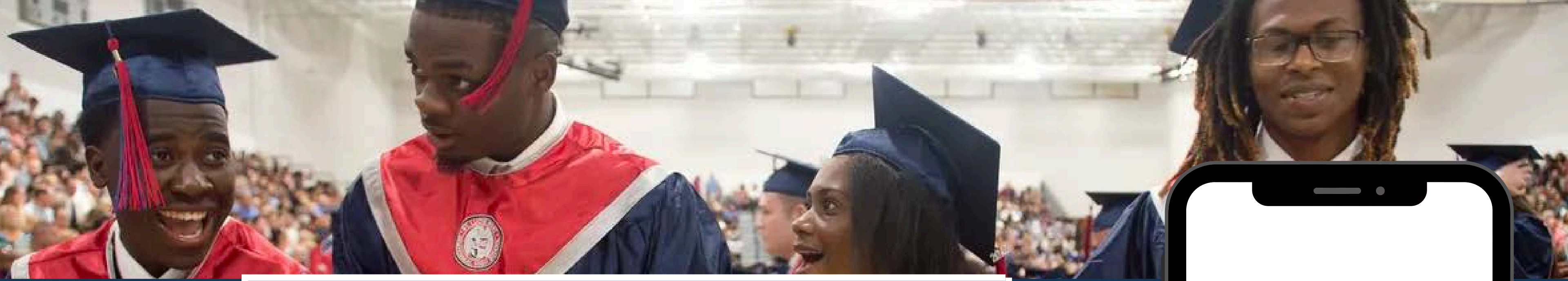
Gold Seal Vocational (GSV)

- Must be enrolled in a career education (A.S. or A.A.S) or certificate program
- Weighted 3.0 GPA in non-elective high school courses
- Take at least 3 full credits in a single CTE program
- Unweighted 3.5 GPA in career education course
- Complete 30 service hours, 100 paid work hours, OR 100 hours of a combination of both.
- Achieve a minimum score on one of the college entrance exams (SAT, ACT or PERT)



Gold Seal Cape (GSC)

- Must be enrolled in a career education (A.S. or A.A.S) or certificate program
- Earn a min. of 5 postsecondary credit hours through CAPE industry certifications that count for college credit
- Complete 30 service hours, 100 paid work hours, OR 100 hours of a combination of both.
