### ATTENDANCE AND IT'S IMPACT

- Do you want to walk across the stage with your friends next May?
- Poor attendance = poor achievement.
- The more days you miss, the more behind you get.
- The more behind you get, the less work that gets done.
- The less work that gets done, the lower the grade.
- Absenteeism in the first month of school can predict poor attendance throughout the school year. Half the students who miss 2-4 days in September go on to miss nearly a month of school.
- Keep great attendance all year!
- If you miss 15 or more unexcused absences in 90 days, you will have your driver's license suspended.
