ATTENDANCE AND IT'S IMPACT

- **Do you want to walk across the stage with your friends next May?**
- Poor attendance = poor achievement.
- The more days you miss, the more behind you get.
- The more behind you get, the less work that gets done.
- The less work that gets done, the lower the grade.
- Absenteeism in the first month of school can predict poor attendance throughout the school year. Half the students who miss 2-4 days in September go on to miss nearly a month of school.
- Keep great attendance all year!
- If you miss 15 or more unexcused absences in 90 days, you will have your driver's license suspended.

To be eligible for all Homecoming events, students must meet all of the following criteria:

- ✓ **Prepared & Productive: Not listed on the Activity Suspension list**
- ✓ **Safe: No fighting offenses of any kind all year**
