Daisy • Grades K-1

Daisies sparkle with that “first time ever” newness in everything they do. They go on field trips, learn about nature and science, explore the arts and their communities - and so much more. Girl Scout Daisies can also earn Learning Petals and patches.



Brownie • Grades 2-3

Brownies work together, earn badges, explore their community, and have fun. Friendship, skill-building, and age-appropriate activities begin at the Girl Scout Brownie meeting and move out to the community and wider world.



Junior • Grades 4-5

Juniors are big-idea thinkers. They're explorers at camp and product designers when they earn their Innovation and Storytelling badges. They connect with their community and earn their Bronze Award. Every day, they wake up ready to play a new role.
