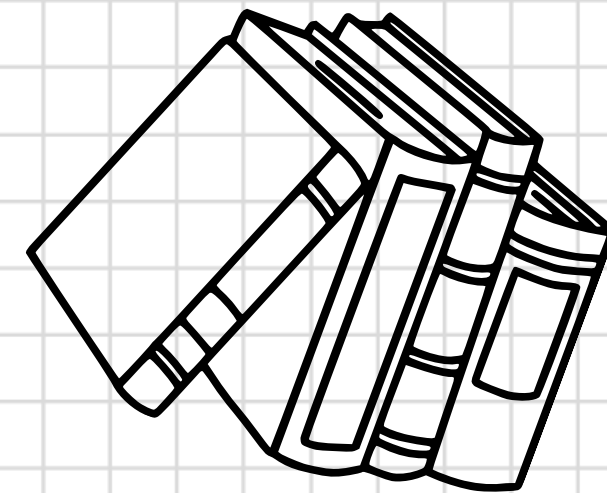
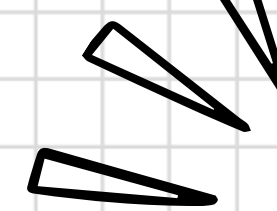
# Career Technical Academies (CTE)

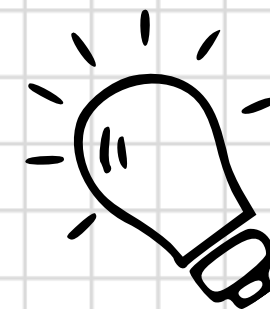
# Choosing Electives

NJROTC requires students to wear a uniform once a week & after school practices are part of the program

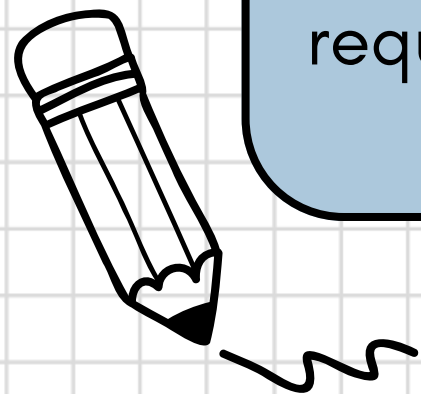


If you are approved for a Curriculum Transfer, you **MUST** request that course


