

# 2019-2020 TREASURE COAST HIGH SCHOOL DRESS CODE

## All Students MUST:

**Be covered from shoulders to knees. This includes any pants that have rips or frays.**

### Dress code violation consequences:

- ◆ 1st—BIC until fixed, lunch detention, level 1 referral
- ◆ 2nd—BIC until fixed, 60 minute after school detention, parent contact, level 2 (open defiance) referral
- ◆ 3rd—BIC until fixed, parent contact, Saturday school
- ◆ 4th—BIC, 1 day Out of School suspension, parent contact
- ◆ 5th—BIC, additional Out of School Suspension days, parent conference



Teachers may designate certain days for Professional Dress. The Professional Dress must adhere to school dress code standards, with the exception to scrubs worn by Medical Academy students and JROTC uniforms.

## Students are not permitted to wear:

- ◆ No head wear permitted, including but not limited to: Hats, visors, bandanas, hoods on head, or sunglasses, shower caps, stocking /wave caps,
- ◆ Flags of any nationality are not permitted on campus or at any school event.
- ◆ NO Biking or "Soffee" shorts, running shorts, leggings, jeggings, yoga pants or pajama pants " Shorts or pants with writing on the backside
- ◆ NO Backless shoes or slippers. NO Jewelry considered unsafe (brass knuckle type rings, studded belts, chains on pants, etc.)
- ◆ NO Sheer (see-through) fabrics. Undergarments **must not be visible** or outlined (through both loose or form-fitted clothing). Pants must be worn at the waist. No excessively baggy shorts or pants.
- ◆ NO Sleeveless shirts, tank or cami tops or shirts that expose the midriff or cleavage, or shirts with cutouts. Dress and skirt length must be to the knees.
- ◆ NO Clothing that is offensive and promotes violence, alcohol, tobacco, drugs or has the potential to compromise campus safety "

## SPIRIT FRIDAY

The following items can be worn.

- School sponsored t-shirt (**unaltered**)
- School sponsored scrubs

If clothing disrupts the educational process and is NOT listed above, or if clothing is identified by law enforcement as promoting unlawful activities, the Administration can/will enforce consequences.
