- 1. Welcome- Meeting called to order at 5:05pm. Attendance: Todd Smith, Regina Roberts, Lauren Kosinski, Alex Oge, Erik Wile, Christine Minch, Heather Ritter, Denise Hunt, Greg Hutchinson, Dominique Thomas, and Shelly Thomas
- 2. Review/Approval October 18, 2022- Minutes reviewed and accepted. Christine Minch motioned the acceptance of the meeting minutes, Erik Wile seconded the acceptance of meeting minutes, and all approved meeting minutes from 10/18/2022.

3. Leadership Team Reviews/Update

 $Mr. Monroe - 9^{th}$: Mr. Smith shares on behalf of Mr. Monroe; we are building momentum. Focused on attendance and at-risk students, and currently holding PST meetings.

 $Mrs. Emerson - 10^{th}$: Mr. Smith shares on behalf of Mrs. Emerson; we are building momentum. Focused on attendance and at-risk students, and currently holding PST meetings.

Mr. Oge – **11**th: Mr. Oge shares testing will resume for Algebra 1 retakes. The testing window opens Nov. 28th. We currently have 55 9th grade students and 157 10th grade students scheduled for retake exams. On Dec 1st, we have 173 12th grade students scheduled for the retake exam. FCLE will take place on Dec 6th. We are continuing to monitor at-risk students. Junior at risk meeting will be held in December, exact date is TBD.

Ms. Roberts – **12th**: Mrs. Roberts shares on Nov 14th we hosted an assembly with Herf Jones for seniors in reference to cap and gown purchases and other merchandise. Purchases can be made at lower rate (\$49) until January 31, 2022. We are continuing to monitor at-risk students, holding PST meetings. 82% seniors attended ACT triple time testing day.

Mr. Wile – AICE: Mr. Wile shares AICE retakes ends on Nov 16th. We had 99% attendance for retakes. Cambridge released the June Series 2023 testing window. The information was sent to all teachers, posted around campus, and posted on TEAMS page for students. No make-up dates for AICE testing, which is why the importance of getting calendar out to students ASAP. We are continuing to monitor at-risk students, holding PST meetings.

4. Principal Report: Mr. Smith shares the A+ School Recognition Funds PowerPoint. 32% of schools in Florida will be recognized. Treasure Coast is being awarded due to earning and A and making gains from a B to an A. There are three different criteria for how funds must be used, nonrecurring bonuses, educational equipment, and temporary personnel. Mr. Smith explained examples of shares and differences between equal shares and non-equal shares between faculty members. An example of the ballot was provided to all members and reviewed it with council.

Hunt motioned all in favor longer ballot (4 members raised hand). Hunt motioned all in favor for shorter ballot (8 members raised hand). Shorter ballot won majority vote.

- **5. Budget Review/Updates:** Mr. Smith shares no new requests. We did receive the printers requested. Still waiting on toner. 2017-2018 school recognition funds, \$10,00 set aside for instructional purposes. Review SAC minutes from 2017-2018 to determine purpose of the funds.

- **6. Guidance Report:** Mr. Hutchinson shares post-secondary options for students; college fair at Fenn Center, over 200 Treasure Coast students attended. We are continuing college tours. Counselors will be visiting classrooms for college and career planning. There are two opportunities for college options at IRSC, a promise program for aspiring teachers and the scholarship program from 2023 graduating seniors. The scholarship program for 2023 graduating seniors is funded year to year, seniors can attend IRSC for free (second year in a row). On Nov 28th we will host FAFSA night. ASVAB interpretation will be held on Dec 5th. Shop with a Titan will be held on Dec 9th. This is the fourth year in a row that Treasure Coast High School students have been able to take students from the local Elementary school to Target in Tradition to shop for holiday presents.
- 7. Youth Advisory Council report: Ms. Thomas shares, first meeting was held in October and second meeting was held on Nov 15th. We reviewed Sunshine Laws and requirements for council. St. Lucie County is up for accreditation and discussions about the community took place.
- **8. Open Forum/Announcement:** Mr. Smith reviews the student survey that will be sent out via school messenger. Survey will take approximately 10-15 minutes. 9th grade students will complete the survey in Freshman Seminar. 10th grade students will complete the survey in US History. 11th grade students will complete the survey in English 3. 12th grade students will complete the survey in English 4. Parent survey will be emailed out via Skyward.
