Senior Fees for the Class of 2025

Senior fees cover the following: diploma, embossed diploma cover, graduation tickets, graduation program, senior pin, senior pinning ceremony, senior pinning program, senior awards, senior t-shirt, senior field day, and senior award program.

Senior fees for the 2024-2025 school year are \$50.00 per student.

The payment for senior fees will be collected by Treasure Coast High School Senior Class Sponsors.

REFUND POLICY

If you have paid your graduation fees and do not graduate in 2025, but you return to Treasure Coast High School in the fall of 2025-2026 school year as a 2^{nd} year Senior, the Senior fee for the Class of 2026 will be waived.

If you do not graduate in May of 2025 and do not return to Treasure Coast High School, NO refund will be issued.

REQUIREMENTS FOR ATTENDING SENIOR ACTIVITIES

Seniors must:

1. HAVE A GOOD ATTENDANCE RECORD.

- A. Excessive absences may result in you NOT being allowed to participate in Senior Activities. No more than four (4) unexcused absences per quarter. Absent notes MUST be turned in a timely manner for excused absences.
- B. Special circumstances will be addressed and considered on an individual basis.
- C. Remember that all notes for absences need to be turned into the attendance office within 3 days of the absence. The note should include first and last name, and student identification number. (56...)

2. Be a Senior of Record (17 or more COMPLETED credits, 2.0 unweighted GPA)

A. School records must verify you are classified as a senior, (at the beginning of the year for first semester activities, at the beginning of second semester for second semester activities) and will graduate in May of 2025.

3. HAVE A GOOD DISCIPLINE RECORD

A. Subject to approval by administration, the deans, and the senior sponsors. No level 3 offenses or higher.

4. TURN IN CORRECTLY COMPLETED and SIGNED PERMISSION FORMS BY THE SPECIFIED DATE

A. **THE ONLY ACCEPTABLE SIGNATURE** for parent/guardian permission for participation in a Senior Trip/Activity is the signature of the Parent or Guardian unless a senior has filed Emancipation Papers with the Attendance Office.

5. SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS

A. <u>ALL FINANCIAL OBLIGATIONS MUST BE PAID IN FULL TO PARTICIPATE IN ALL SENIOR</u> <u>ACTIVITIES.</u>

At Treasure Coast High School, it is expected that ALL students will be on their best behavior at all senior activities. Seniors who do not follow the rules at any of the senior activities will NOT be permitted to attend other senior functions. You may also be subject to a discipline referral, along with disciplinary action.

SENIOR PINNING CEREMONY

The Senior Pinning Ceremony will be held in the gymnasium. The entrance is located behind TCHS. The date and time for the Senior Pinning Ceremony is February 6, 2025 at 6 P.M. in the school gymnasium

Senior Pinning Requirements: Students enrolled at TCHS prior to ceremony date and have a minimum GPA of 2.0 and have earned 21/24 credits (Standard Diploma) or have earned 15/18 credits (ACCEL Diploma).

Dress code: Seniors should dress professionally in shirt, tie, dress pants, dress socks, dress shoes OR appropriate length dresses, dress pants and a blouse, skirt and a blouse, dress shoes with backs (skirts and dresses should be no more than one inch above the knee). **No sneakers, jeans, headphones/earbuds for anyone.**

Cap/Gown for Graduation

The cost of Cap/Gown are <u>NOT</u> included with Treasure Coast High's Senior Fees. These items are all purchased through Herff Jones.

The deadline for Cap and Gown online orders will be April 30th. Beginning May 1st, Cap and Gowns can only be purchased during the first Graduation Practice, cost \$76.95 cash.

Measurement for Graduation Cap and Gown

The ordering of your cap and gown for graduation will be taken by Herff Jones.

Prices for the class of 2025 - Caps and Gown will be \$52.00 payable to Herff Jones through their online website until December 31st. The price will increase to \$62.00 on February 1st. Students who are borrowing a cap and gown, but need a 2025 tassel and TCHS hood, the cost is \$31.00.

To graduate in 2025, you are **REQUIRED** to attend the two (2) rehearsals that will guide you through the Graduation Ceremony activities. These practices will be held at TCHS in the Gymnasium, *along with gown pickup*, and the second practice will be held at TCHS Gymnasium for a full graduation rehearsal along with obligation clearance and graduation ticket pick up.

Graduation – May 22, 2025 at the St. Lucie County Fairgrounds

Graduates must arrive fully dressed in cap/gown by 7:00 a.m.

Required dress code for graduation

Dresses or skirts/blouses:

Dresses, skirts, and blouses should be a darker solid color as bright or light colors show through the gown. If stockings are worn, they should be flesh colored. Do not let your dress show below the hem of your gown.

Dress pants:

Dress pants must be black with a darker solid color dress shirt. You must wear black shoes with dark colored socks.

Shoes:

Dress shoes must be all black. <u>Thong type shoes (any type of flip flop) and tennis shoes/sneakers are not allowed</u>. This is a safety issue for your protection as you are going up and down the stairs of a stage and to protect the formality of the event.

Students are expected to arrive in their cap and gown to gain entry to the Fairgrounds.

PICKING UP YOUR CAP, GOWN, & TICKETS FOR GRADUATION

Your CAP and GOWN may be picked up during our first mandatory practice.

Before your graduation tickets and caps and gowns can be issued to you, all obligations...Dual Enrollment books, library fines, parking fines, athletics, uniforms, activity money, computers, camera equipment, testing

fees, and any other outstanding obligation with St. Lucie County Schools must be cleared. Senior Fees must also be paid.

Please note the following;

If you have morning senior privileges, you are still required to make arrangements to be at the senior meetings.

Senior updates will be sent via Teams.

It is the responsibility of all seniors to check with the sponsors and to look on the school website and the Class of 2025 Teams Page for updates.

APPENDIX A

Senior Cords

Senior Cord Night is on April 10th at 6 PM. Only seniors who have earned an Academic Honors Society or Organization Cord, Academy Honors Cord, or Certification Cord will be invited to attend this ceremony.

GPA based Honor Cord Requirements

Based on classes from 9th grade to the end of 1st Semester in 12th grade, students who qualify for an Academic Honor Cord will receive an invitation to purchase cords. Honors, High Honors, AA Degree, and AICE stole recipients will not be recognized at Senior Cord Night. These students are recognized during the Graduation Ceremony on May 22nd.

Graduating with High Honors – Gold

Students must have a 3.8 or higher Weighted Overall GPA Cost of Cord- \$8.00 and purchased through senior sponsors- Ms. Homer & Ms. Berrios

Graduating with Honors – Silver

Students must have a 3.0 – 3.799 Weighted Overall GPA Cost of Cord- \$8.00 and purchased through senior sponsors- Ms. Homer & Ms. Berrios

Graduating with AA Degree- Gold, Black, Royal Blue

Cost of Cord- \$10 and purchased through Director of School Counseling- Ms. Sommer

 - Member of a Career and Technical Student Organization (FBLA, DECA)

Commencement Ceremony 2025 Information

When and where will the Commencement Ceremony be held?

Time and Date - 8:00 a.m. on Thursday, May 22, 2025. The ceremony will be held at Adams Arena at the St. Lucie County Fairgrounds – 15601 W. Midway Road Fort Pierce, Florida. The ceremony will begin promptly at 8:00 A.M.

Graduates must arrive one (1) hour prior to the start of the ceremony and remain for the entire event. Students who arrive after the ceremony has begun will not be allowed to their assigned seat. Late students will sit behind all graduates seated on the floor. Gates will open for guests at TBA.

Will the Commencement Ceremony be live streamed?

Yes, the ceremony will be streamed live from the district website, Comcast Channel 13 & 1, Blue Stream Fiber Channel 19, ATT TV Channel 99, and SLPS Facebook Live page. The Graduation Ceremony will also be available for playback on WLX – Horizon app the week following graduation.

Tickets FAQs

Who needs a ticket to attend the Commencement Ceremony?

All guests, regardless of age, will need a ticket to enter the Fairgrounds/Adams Arena.

Does a baby or young child need a ticket?

Yes, everyone entering the Fairgrounds/Adams Arena needs a ticket, regardless of age.

When will students receive their tickets?

Students will receive their (Number of tickets TBA) Graduation tickets once they have met the following requirements: 24/18 credits, a 2.0 GPA, all obligations to the school are met, and they have visited the mandatory stations during graduation practice two (2). If students have met the aforementioned requirements, they will receive their tickets on TBA at the end of Graduation Practice.

Can I wear a custom or outside of school-issued cord/stole, medallion, or pin at commencement?

No. Only approved academic regalia designated and issued at or by Treasure Coast High School or the St. Lucie County School District may be worn during the ceremony. Approved items: AICE Stoles, Top Ten Medals, State Championship medal (1), Class Officer Stoles, Valedictorian and Salutatorian Stoles, AA cord, Stoles awarded at Scholarship Night, Honors/High Honors Cords, Academy Cords, CTE Cords, Honor Society Cords, AFJROTC Cords, CNA Pins, Youth Advisory Council Cords, Young Floridian Cords, and Senior Pins.

Can caps be decorated?

No. Students entering graduation with a decorated cap will not be permitted into the arena. Caps must not be decorated at all.

Can earbuds be worn into the arena by seniors?

No. All students will be asked to remove earbuds or headphones prior to processing into the arena. Students will not be permitted into the arena with earbuds or headphones.

What should I do if I lose part of my regalia before the ceremony?

Secure your items. In the case that an item is lost, please see the Senior Class Sponsor (Ms. Berrios or Mrs. Homer) who is assigned to your building. Your line leader can help you.

What should I wear under my graduation gown?

Students may wear the following attire under their graduation gown: dress shirt or blouse, dress shirt and tie, dark dress or dark dress pants and dark dress shoes. For your own safety and comfort, high-heeled and/or open-toe shoes are not recommended. Closed-toe low heels or flats are strongly recommended.

Where should I report and when should I arrive at the Commencement Ceremony?

All graduating seniors will be allowed entry to Buildings A and B at 7:00 a.m. Students will be given their Building Assignments at Graduation Practice. All students should report to their assigned building and check in with their assigned line leader. Students should use the restrooms after attendance is taken to avoid waiting until the last minute. You must remain with your line leader.

When do I receive my name card?

After the processional and all students are seated, your line leaders will pass down your name cards. You will bring this up to the stage when your line is raised. As you approach the stage, you will hand in your name card to the person reading names. DO NOT FORGET YOUR NAME CARD AT YOUR SEAT!

What if I arrive after the ceremony begins?

Go directly to the arena entrance and a staff member will escort you to a seat behind the rest of the students. You will go up to the stage at the end of the last line.

Where do I place my personal belongings?

There is NO place to store personal belongings. Please leave all personal belongings at home, in your vehicle, or with a family member before you enter the Fairgrounds. The School District, Treasure Coast HS, and the Fairgrounds cannot be responsible for securing student valuables.

When will I receive my diploma?

Printed diplomas and envelopes will be distributed to all graduates immediately after the ceremony in your assigned Building (A or B). As soon as the recessional takes place, students will follow their line into their

assigned building. Your line leaders will have your diplomas. ALL GRADUATES MUST SIGN FOR THEIR DIPLOMAS.

Guest FAQs

When should my family & guests arrive for the Commencement Ceremony?

Family and guests should plan to arrive at least one (1) hour prior to the start of the ceremony which will begin promptly at 8:00 a.m. They should expect a heavy volume of traffic and allow time to park and walk to the ceremony site. **Doors will open for all ticketed guests at TBA and are temporarily closed during the start of the ceremony.**

Where do ticketed guests enter the venue?

Guests, family, and friends will use the front/main/North entrance. (Ticket Booth)

Are guests allowed to bring water or video cameras into the venue?

Yes. Guests, family, and friends are allowed to bring water, cameras, or video cameras. However, balloons, and/or airhorns or other noise makers are NOT allowed. Please be considerate of those around you.

Special Accommodations FAQs

Are there special accommodations for parking and seating?

There are limited, special parking and seating areas for individuals needing special accommodations. Please plan to arrive early.

Are there other special accommodations available?

Yes. A sign language interpreter will be visibly located and signing during the ceremony.
