

Dual Enrollment and FLVS

- Limited to no way to access grades or monitor progress through the schools
- Students fail to log into their classes - run the risk of incomplete work before graduation
- If a student is unsuccessful in an FLVS course (including being withdrawn)
 - No Edgenuity (credit recovery)
 - Must sit in a class to make up credit
 - This will lead them to being unable to complete in time to graduate

OBLIGATIONS

- Before caps, gowns, and graduation tickets are issued to seniors, all **obligations** must be cleared. - Students must have at least a 3.0 weighted overall GPA
- Have completed at least 3 sequential courses in that academy content area
- (Ex. Level 1, 2, & 3 or Level 1, 2, & AICE, or Level 2, 3, 4)
- Have an average GPA of 3.0 weighted in those three academy content courses

Dress pants must be black with a darker solid color dress shirt. You must wear black shoes with dark colored socks.



Shoes:

Students are expected to arrive wearing their cap and gown.




Class of 2026 TEAMS Page
